Re: Sprint Nextel's Status Report on 800 MHz Band Reconfiguration
WT Docket 02-55

Dear Mr. Furth:

Sprint Nextel Corporation ("Sprint Nextel") hereby files the attached report regarding the 800 MHz band reconfiguration progress with the Federal Communications Commission ("Commission") and the 800 MHz Transition Administrator, LLC ("TA"). In its September 12, 2007 *Third Memorandum Opinion and Order* in the above-captioned proceeding, the Commission required Sprint Nextel to submit monthly reports regarding its clearing of Channels 1-120 (Phase I) and the Expansion Band and NPSPAC channel block (Phase II).¹ Through the efforts of all parties, substantial progress in 800 MHz band reconfiguration continues.

In Phase I, Sprint Nextel has completed the retuning of all non-Sprint Nextel, non-Southern LINC Channel 1-120 incumbent licensees in forty-nine NPSPAC regions. In the seven remaining NPSPAC regions or U.S. Territories in which Channel 1-120 clearing has not been fully completed, four NPSPAC Regions have only one 1-120 Channel licensees remaining to be retuned. Overall, more than 98 percent of the nearly 1200 Channel 1-120 licensees that must be retuned during Phase I of 800 MHz band reconfiguration have been retuned. *See Figure 1.*

Phase II of 800 MHz band reconfiguration continues to show strong progress. Two NPSPAC Regions are now 100% complete with all retuning: Wyoming and South Dakota. In five other NPSPAC Regions Sprint Nextel has completed Phase I and Phase II retuning in the non-border portions of the NPSPAC Region, with only a small number of border-area retunes or ESMR band relocations left to accomplish. In addition, in the Utah NPSPAC Region, Sprint Nextel is pleased to report that the Utah Communications Agency Network ("UCAN"), Utah's state-wide public safety communications system has completed its retune, making it one of the largest Phase II systems in the country to complete its retune.

Overall, three-hundred eighty-three (383) non-border area public safety licensees (Expansion Band and NPSPAC) have completed retuning to their new channel assignments, an over forty percent (40%) completion rate across the country. Including these completed retunes, about eighty-four percent (84%) of all non-border area public safety licensees who must be retuned (768 of approximately 927) have signed Frequency Reconfiguration Agreements (“FRAs”) and are at various stages of retuning their systems. Of the remaining 99 non-border licensees without FRAs, over half have provided Sprint Nextel the cost estimates necessary to negotiate FRAs. All remaining licensees are in the TA-supervised mediation process that should assist the parties in reaching FRAs so that they can move on to retuning their systems. Taken together, Sprint Nextel has signed all of the non-border area public safety FRAs which will be required to complete band reconfiguration in twenty-three (23) of the fifty-six (56) NPSPAC regions.

Sprint Nextel also takes this opportunity to provide an update on the initiation of the planning, negotiation and retuning process in the US – Canadian border area. In the short time that the public safety and business/industrial land transportation (“B/ILT”) community has had the new 800 MHz band plans available, a significant amount of progress has occurred. Over 300 public safety and B/ILT licensees in each of the border regions have received their replacement frequency proposals from the TA and negotiations and planning efforts are well underway. Sixty-two Planning Funding Agreements (“PFA’s) have already been signed, with one other PFA under review at the TA. Some licensees are moving directly to the FRA and implementation stage or have completed their planning efforts, as sixty-six FRA’s have been signed and another eight are pending for review at the TA.

Starting on March 17, 2008, public safety licensees across all NPSPAC regions were required to file requests for extensions of time or waiver of the Commission’s June 26, 2008 reconfiguration completion deadline if they did not expect to complete their retunes by that date. The Bureau acted on nearly 500 requests, waiving the June 26, 2008 deadline for hundreds of

NPSPAC licensees.² On June 9, 2009, the Bureau adopted a new deadline of October 1, 2009 for public safety licensees to complete their rebanding work or to seek additional time.³

Recognizing that these public safety licensees were not prepared to complete their retunes by June 26, 2008, the Bureau granted Sprint Nextel a waiver to permit it continued access to Channels 1-120 where the Bureau has granted corresponding waivers to give NPSPAC licensees more time to retune to those channels.⁴ Where Sprint Nextel remains on the 1-120 channels, the

Bureau required that it clear the required channels for retuning public safety incumbents on 60 days' notice that they are ready to retune, consistent with prior Commission requirements. As listed in Figure 4, 365 Phase II NPSPAC licensees have already established with Sprint Nextel a firm date for starting and completing their physical retuning work and many have, in fact, finished their retunes. Overall, Sprint Nextel has been notified of and has already or is prepared to timely provide cleared replacement channels for over 951 public safety agencies that have made *ad hoc* requests or have participated in TA-sponsored regional planning meetings, an increase of more than 30 licensees since last month's report. The dates for these retunes are responsive to the requirements of each public safety licensee.⁵

As Figure 3 demonstrates there continues to be significant progress in transitioning from FRA negotiations to implementation of Phase II NPSPAC retuning. In twelve NPSPAC regions, Sprint Nextel has completed the clearing of its operations from all of the 1-120 channels (the "new NPSPAC" band) and, pursuant to the FRAs with individual incumbent licensees, has made all of these channels available to NPSPAC licensees to complete their retuning in accordance with their schedules. Sprint Nextel continues to work diligently with all licensees so that they complete their retunes and so that Sprint Nextel receives its replacement spectrum at 866-869 MHz on the spectrum formerly occupied by these retuning licensees. Accordingly, Sprint Nextel has also continued to transition its operations from the 1-120 channels to the "old NPSPAC" band at 866-869 MHz without incident.

Based on this significant progress, Sprint Nextel is also working closely with the 800 MHz TA to verify Sprint Nextel and the public safety's progress towards completion of rebanding on a NPSPAC-region-by-NPSPAC-region basis. Verification of this benchmark progress will allow Sprint Nextel to make additional 800 MHz "interleaved" spectrum available to the Commission for relicensing for new systems and system expansion. Based on the progress of public safety licensees in completing their NPSPAC retunes in certain regions, a number of NPSPAC Regions, including Minnesota, Wisconsin, Colorado, Utah, Iowa, Nebraska, Missouri, Illinois, New Mexico, Tennessee and Alabama have each advanced past the Commission's initial progress benchmarks such that additional 800 MHz interleaved spectrum will be available for relicensing by public safety licensees to expand or modify their systems in those NPSPAC regions.

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Sprint Nextel appreciates the continuing opportunity to update the Commission on the substantial progress being made in 800 MHz band reconfiguration. We remain available to discuss this Report at the Bureau's convenience. Sprint Nextel remains committed to completing this important initiative; however, as the information contained herein demonstrates, Sprint Nextel cannot complete 800 MHz band reconfiguration until all affected incumbent licensees complete their individual retuning activities.
