**Re: Notice of Ex Parte Presentation
Tribune Company, Debtor-in-Possession
MB Docket No. 10-104**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On August 2, 2010, the undersigned, as attorney for Tribune Company, Debtor-in-Possession ("Tribune"), and Richard E. Wiley, as attorney for JPMorgan Chase Bank, N.A., administrative agent under the Tribune Company Credit Agreement dated May 17, 2007 (collectively, the "Tribune Representatives"), met with Barbara Kreisman, Division Chief; Clay Pendarvis, Associate Division Chief; David Roberts, Attorney Advisor; and Adrienne Denysyk, Attorney Advisor, of the Media Bureau's Video Division to discuss matters related to the above-referenced docket.

The Tribune Representatives provided a short overview of the matters contained in Tribune's applications for assignment of its broadcast licenses as part of the company's emergence from bankruptcy later this year (the "Applications"). The Tribune Representatives noted that the oppositions to Tribune's Applications provided no basis for delaying processing of the Applications or for denying the requested waivers. The parties discussed the mechanics and timing of processing the Applications and the Tribune Representatives reemphasized the need for expeditious processing of the Applications to ensure that the assignment of the company's broadcast licenses can be completed following the Bankruptcy Court's approval of Tribune's plan of reorganization (the "Plan").


The parties also discussed the progressing of Tribune's Plan at the Bankruptcy Court. Specifically, the parties discussed the upcoming August 6 date for shareholder's to vote on the Plan, the recent completion of the Examiner's Report and its submission in the bankruptcy proceeding, and the scheduled August 30 hearing, at which the Bankruptcy Court will consider approval of the Plan. The Tribune Representatives agreed to keep the Commission apprised of any further developments at the Bankruptcy Court that might require additional filings with the Commission.

The Tribune Representatives also discussed the ownership structure for the reorganized Tribune Company that would emerge from bankruptcy upon Court approval, as reflected in Tribune's filings in this matter.
