On October 25, 2010, the undersigned of this Firm, together with DeDe Lea, Executive Vice President, Government Relations; and Keith Murphy, Vice President, Government Relations, Viacom Inc. ("Viacom") met with Edward Lazarus, Chief of Staff for Chairman Julius Genachowski, in connection with the above-referenced proceeding. Mr. Murphy and Ms. Lea participated via telephone conference.


In particular, the Viacom representatives discussed issues related to the impact that the Comcast/NBCU transaction will have on the distribution of independent programming. They explained that, given the operator's size and geographic footprint, carriage on Comcast is critically important for the success of programming and creation of new channels and offerings to consumers. The Viacom representatives asked the Commission to continue closely examining whether the proposed deal would result in changes in incentives and increased market power that could further disadvantage independent sources of programming.
