On December 10, 2010, David L. Cohen, Executive Vice President, and Kathy Zachem, Vice President, Regulatory and State Legislative Affairs, both of Comcast Corporation; Rick Cotton, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, NBC Universal, Inc.; Ron Stern, Vice President and Senior Competition Counsel, General Electric Company; Arthur Burke, Davis Polk & Wardwell LLP; Joe Sims, Jones Day; and the undersigned (collectively, "Applicants") met with the following Commission staff regarding the above-captioned proceeding: Edward Lazarus and Rick Kaplan from the Office of the Chairman; Austin Schlick and John Flynn from the Office of General Counsel; Paul de Sa and Jonathan Baker from the Office of Strategic Policy and Planning; and William Lake from the Media Bureau. The Meeting was also attended by the following staff from the Antitrust Division of the Department of Justice: John Read, David Kully, and Owen Kendler from the Litigation III Section; Joseph Matelis, Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General; and Nancy Goodman and Yvette Tarlov from the Telecommunications and Media Enforcement Section.

Applicants explained that the voluntary conditions they have previously offered in this proceeding demonstrate that the proposed transaction is strongly in the public interest. Applicants described the status of the record, including the factual and economic analyses that Applicants have submitted in the record with respect to program access and online video distribution. Applicants also discussed a number of potential conditions that are currently under consideration by the Commission and described the implications of those potential conditions on the Comcast and NBC Universal businesses. Applicants' discussion included potential conditions related to online video distribution, program access, the provision of broadband Internet services, and Hulu.
