On December 14, 2010, Rick Cotton, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, NBC Universal, Inc.; Ron Stern, Vice President and Senior Competition Counsel, General Electric Company; William Baer, Arnold & Porter LLP; Arthur Burke, Davis Polk & Wardwell LLP; Joe Sims, Jones Day; and the undersigned (collectively, "Applicants") met with the following representatives of the Antitrust Division of the Department of Justice: Joseph Matelis, Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General; John Read, Litigation III Section; W. Robert Majure, Competition Policy Section; Erica Mintzer, Legal Policy Section; and Nancy Goodman, Yvette Tarlov, and Matthew Hammond, Telecommunications and Media Enforcement Section. The meeting was also attended by the following representatives of the Federal Communications Commission: John Flynn, Senior Counsel to the Chairman for Transactions, and William Lake, Chief of the Media Bureau.

Applicants discussed issues that have been raised in this proceeding, including distribution of online video, program access, Hulu, open Internet, and arbitration. Applicants described the negative consequences of conditions in these areas for competition, consumers, and for the Comcast and NBC Universal businesses. Consistent with their prior written submissions, Applicants reiterated that there is no basis in the factual, legal, or economic record for conditions in these areas.
