
Dear Ms. Dortch:

QUALCOMM, Inc. (“Qualcomm”) requests a thirty-day extension of time to respond to the Federal Communications Commission’s May 20, 2011 General Information Request Regarding the AT&T/Qualcomm Transaction (the “Request”). Qualcomm intends to provide a partial response to the Request containing narrative responses to the Request’s questions and a set of responsive documents on June 10, or five business days after the Commission issues a second protective order, whichever occurs later.

The Request instructs Qualcomm to respond in only fourteen days. This period of time is inadequate given the scale of the Request. Responding to the Request involves searching through hundreds of thousands of emails and other documents ranging over a two-year period. Once Qualcomm completes this search, it must review, code, privilege log, and produce these emails and documents. Qualcomm is working hard to be completely responsive and to identify emails and other documents in a way that will allow easy review by FCC staff. But it is unable to complete this task in the fourteen days provided.
