Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 20, 2011, Stephen Gunn and Douglas Moore of CREDO Mobile, Inc. ("CREDO") met with the following individuals from the Federal Communications Commission ("FCC"): Renata Hesse, Patrick DeGraba, Tom Peters and Jim Bird.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the adverse impact the merger would have on competition and consumers. CREDO (formerly Working Assets) introduced itself as an MVNO currently on the Sprint network, and noted that its family of companies has more than 20 years nationwide telecommunications experience. CREDO currently offers nationwide, post-paid mobile to consumers and is an attractive choice for consumers seeking a post-paid option.

CREDO highlighted the negative impact the merger would have on the wholesale market. CREDO pointed out that T-Mobile is not only a significant, competitive player in the retail space but also the wholesale space.

CREDO also discussed how the merger would adversely affect the availability of mobile handsets. Modestly-sized market players already find it difficult to encourage handset manufacturers to work directly with them. Handset exclusivity deals further restrict smaller carriers' ability to compete. In an already difficult environment with handset exclusivity deals, this merger presents a serious risk to the availability of handsets to customers of smaller carriers.

CREDO is not only a telecommunications company; it also has a progressive mission. Via its advocacy site, CREDO Action, CREDO offers tools to members of the general public to make it easy for them to express their opinions to governmental entities on topics of public

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concern. Over 100,000 consumer comments were generated via CREDO Action and submitted to the FCC reflecting the public's concern about the merger.

Finally, CREDO expressed its position that the relevant market in which this merger should be evaluated is national.
