Dear Ms. Dortch:

This is to report that on Friday, September 30, 2011, I spoke by telephone with Rick Kaplan, Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, and Renata Hesse, Special Counsel for Transactions, about the above-referenced docket, which concerns the application for approval of the proposed assignment of Qualcomm's Lower 700 MHz spectrum to AT&T (the "Qualcomm/AT&T Assignment Application").

During the call, I urged the expeditious approval of the Qualcomm/AT&T Assignment Application to enable the world's first deployment of supplemental downlink technology on the spectrum that Qualcomm proposes to assign to AT&T. I also explained that participants from 16 European administrations, as well as representatives from industry associations, carriers and vendors from Europe and around the world, recently met to consider a pan-European allocation of spectrum for deployment of supplemental downlink, which would occur in an unpaired frequency band not available in the United States.

Thus, to ensure that the United States retains global leadership in mobile broadband technological innovation, the Qualcomm/AT&T Assignment Application should be granted as soon as possible.
