Dear Madam Secretary:

On behalf of Cellular South, Inc. d/b/a C Spire Wireless (“C Spire”), and pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. Section 1.1206, we hereby provide you with notice of an oral *ex parte* presentation in connection with the above-referenced proceedings.

On Thursday, November 3, 2011, C Spire, represented by Eric Graham, Ben Moncrief, Kevin Joseph and David Nace, met with Rick Kaplan, Jim Schlichting, John Leibovitz, Tom Peters and Nese Guendelsberger of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau to discuss its efforts to deploy LTE services in the Lower 700 MHz Band. Specifically, C Spire explained how it has been prevented from deploying LTE services in its licensed spectrum due to a lack of interoperability among Lower 700 MHz Band devices. C Spire further explained how interoperability would drive the development of a Band Class 12 ecosystem and allow competitive carriers to utilize their spectrum licenses to provide 4G services. C Spire stated that any approval of the proposed 700 MHz license assignment by QUALCOMM Incorporated to AT&T should be

conditioned upon device interoperability across the entire Lower 700 MHz Band.
