
Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 22, 2011 Paul Jacobs, Chairman of the Board and Chief Executive Officer of Qualcomm Incorporated (Qualcomm) spoke to FCC Chairman Julius Genachowski about the above-captioned matter. Chairman Genachowski informed Dr. Jacobs that he would be circulating an order conditionally approving Qualcomm's proposed sale of its spectrum to AT&T. Dr. Jacobs discussed the importance of the FCC approving the proposed spectrum sale as soon as possible.

In addition, on November 23, 2011 Dean Brenner of Qualcomm Incorporated ("Qualcomm") and the undersigned met with Mark Stone, Chief of Staff for Commissioner Capps, and Louis Peraertz, Legal Advisor for Commissioner Clyburn. We discussed the above-captioned proceeding, and presented the attached slides. Specifically we described the nature of the proposed spectrum sale—the fact that the transaction involves only the assignment of spectrum and not customers or businesses—Qualcomm's initial acquisition of its 700 MHz licenses and experience with the FLO TV business; and how deployment of new supplemental downlink technology on the unpaired spectrum being sold to AT&T will promote the public interest by using the unpaired spectrum in the most efficient manner possible, will advance the FCC's spectrum policies, and will support US innovation and enhance US global leadership in mobile technology. Mr. Brenner explained how unpaired spectrum differs from paired spectrum. Mr. Brenner also explained how the use of supplemental downlink would reduce the potential for interference between operations on Channels 56 and 57 in the five Economic Areas in which AT&T is acquiring Lower E block spectrum from Qualcomm and that AT&T has committed not to bond the Lower D and E block spectrum it is acquiring to the Lower B and C block spectrum it owns in order to avoid any self-interference within handsets.
