Dear Ms. Dortch:

A few commenters have raised issues in their recent ex parte filings about DSL service in areas where the parties' commercial agreements will be in effect. Verizon continues to maintain that these concerns are unwarranted and, in any event, have no material relevance to the license transfer applications at issue in this proceeding. Indeed, DSL service is offered by Verizon's wireline local telephone companies, which are not parties to the commercial agreements or to the license transfers at issue here, and those agreements impose no restrictions on those companies or on their DSL services.

Nonetheless, Verizon is willing to commit to provide the FCC with periodic reports regarding Verizon's DSL services to enable it to monitor marketplace developments. The scope of this commitment is outlined in the attachment herein. These commitments will become effective upon approval of the license transfer applications in the above-referenced proceeding and continue for five years.

# Appendix A

Verizon agrees to provide, subject to an appropriate protective order, the following reports retroactively to January 2010 where available, and on a semi-annual basis from the date of the order going forward:

- (1) The number of DSL qualified households, exclusive of households where FiOS is available for sale (to be determined by a method agreed to by Verizon and the Commission), by wire center, by month.
- (2) The number of DSL lines, by wire center, by month.
- (3) The number of gross adds of DSL lines, by wire center, by month.
- (4) The number of disconnects of DSL lines, by wire center, by month.
- (5) The number of DSL lines by speed tier, by state, by month.
- (6) The number of DSL lines identified in Verizon's systems as disconnecting Verizon DSL service and subscribing to a FiOS service, by state, by month.
- (7) Average data revenue, as maintained in the ordinary course, per consumer DSL account by wire center, by month.
