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MEDIA BUREAU ANNOUNCES PERMIT-BUT-DISCLOSE EX PARTE STATUS FOR APPLICATIONS SEEKING CONSENT TO ASSIGN BROADCAST RADIO LICENSES HELD BY SUBSIDIARIES OF CLEAR CHANNEL COMMUNICATIONS, INC.

On May 14, 2007, applications were filed seeking Commission consent to the assignment of the licenses of 187 full-power broadcast radio licenses and associated radio translator licenses (the "Assignment Applications") from 6 wholly-owned subsidiaries of Clear Channel Communications, Inc., to GoodRadio.TV License, LLC ("GoodRadio.TV"). In addition, on May 29, 2007, an application was filed to assign certain of these licenses from GoodRadio.TV to Leibowitz Station Trust, LLC, as trustee (the "Trust Application"). On May 17th and 18th, 2007, the Media Bureau issued Broadcast Actions Public Notices (*Broadcast Applications*, Report Nos. 26488 and 26489, respectively) announcing that the Assignment Applications had been accepted for filing. On June 5, 2007, the Media Bureau issued a Broadcast Actions Public Notice (*Broadcast Applications*, Report No. 26500) announcing that the Trust Application had been accepted for filing. These Public Notices also established a pleading cycle to permit interested parties an opportunity to comment on the proposed transaction. The petition-to-deny period for the Assignment Applications ended at close of business on June 18, 2007, and the petition-to-deny period for the Trust Application ends at close of business on July 5, 2007. 47 C.F.R. §73.3584(a).

Applications for consent to assign broadcast licenses and authorizations are subject, unless otherwise provided, to treatment by the Commission as restricted proceedings for ex parte purposes under Section 1.1208 of the Commission's rules. 47 C.F.R. §1.1208. We have concluded, however, that classifying this proceeding as permit-but-disclose would, in this case, serve the public interest. Accordingly, by this Public Notice, and pursuant to Section 1.1200(a) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. §1.1200(a), we announce that the ex parte procedures applicable to nonrestricted proceedings will govern our consideration of the instant applications. See 47 C.F.R. §1.1206.

Permit-but-disclose ex parte procedures permit interested parties to make ex parte presentations to the Commissioners and Commission employees and require that these presentations be disclosed in the record of the relevant proceeding. Persons making a written ex parte presentation to the Commissioners or Commission employees must file the written presentation with the Commission Secretary no later than the next business day after the presentation. 47 C.F.R. §1.1206(b)(1). Persons making oral ex parte presentations must file a summary of the

presentation no later than the next business day after the presentation. 47 C.F.R. §1.1206(b)(2). All ex parte filings must be clearly labeled as such and must reference this Public Notice, DA 07-2760.

An original and one copy of all ex parte written presentations and memoranda must be filed with the Commission's Secretary.
