PUBLIC SAFETY AND HOMELAND SECURITY BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON APPLICATION AND WAIVER REQUEST FILED BY CITY AND COUNTY OF DENVER, COLORADO FOR 800 MHZ BUSINESS/INDUSTRIAL/LAND TRANSPORTATION FREQUENCIES

The City and County of Denver (Denver) filed an application to address coverage deficiencies in its 800 MHz simulcast system at various locations within Denver's service area.¹ Since the channels Denver seeks to license are allocated to the 800 MHz Business/Industrial/Land Transportation, (B/ILT) Category, Denver seeks a waiver of Section 90.617(b) of the Commission's rules.²

Denver proposes to operate two B/ILT Pool channels at sites located within the county.³ Denver states that it needs to "utilize the channels primarily to correct the problems being experienced by the [Denver] fire departments, as well as, for coverage enhancement for other public safety departments as well."⁴ Denver submits that the fire Departments have been experiencing "in-building" and outdoor coverage deficiencies.⁵ Denver notes that as the most populous municipality in the State of Colorado, "grant of this application is in the public interest" because "all cities and communities within Denver County rely exclusively on Denver for police, fire, and EMS service."⁶

In support of its waiver request, Denver provides a Co-Channel letter of consent from the Denver Public Schools (DPS) and a Co-Channel Contour Study for both B/ILT proposed channels.⁷ DPS is currently licensed to operate on the channels that Denver requests and Denver's proposed operations on those channels would be short-spaced to DPS' facilities, call signs WNFW820 and WNQQ745.⁸ DPS states that it and Denver agree to "accept and/or work to cure any interference resulting from the reduced separation between the systems."⁹ Additionally, Denver claims that it has no alternative but to use the proposed B/ILT channels.¹⁰ In support of that assertion, Denver provides a frequency search showing that there are no public safety channels available for its proposed use.¹¹ Denver also submitted a letter from the American Association of State Highway Transportation Officials (AASHTO), certifying that "the frequencies and locations being applied for do not have any Public Safety frequencies available for licensing."¹²

We seek comment on Denver's waiver request to incorporate B/ILT channels into its 800 MHz simulcast system. In particular, we seek comment from any parties who would be impacted by Denver's use of these frequencies. We further note that although a request for waiver of the freeze on intercategory sharing was not requested, it is implicit when seeking B/ILT channels.¹³

Interested parties may file comments on or before July 26, 2015.¹⁴ Parties may file replies on or before August 10, 2015.¹⁵ Parties may file statements and replies electronically¹⁶ or by paper.

All comments and reply comments should reference the subject Denver Waiver Request and the DA number indicated on this *Public Notice*. Comments may be filed: (1) electronically by accessing the

applicant's file number(s) in the Commission's Universal Service Licensing System (ULS),¹⁷ or (2) by filing paper copies.

<u>Electronic Filers</u>: Pleadings may be submitted electronically as follows:

- From the ULS website at http://wireless.fcc.gov/uls/, begin the process of submitting a pleading by clicking on the "ULS Pleadings" link in the menu on the lower left side of the ULS web page. The link will take you to the "*Pleading Information*" screen for "Non-docketed Pleadings" where you select "Reply" in the drop-down window for the type of pleading and then enter the pleadings filer information. Completion of the contact information is optional. Upon completion of this screen, please note the instructions for the filing: "*Pleadings must be dated and must include a signature, in this instance an electronic signature, and the address and phone number of the signing party*."¹⁸ Click on "CONTINUE."
- The second step is to complete the *File Numbers/Call Signs* screen. Click if the pleading pertains to a File Number or Call Sign and enter the File Number or Call Sign. Please note that you must enter a File Number or Call Sign to continue. If the pleading pertains to multiple applications or licenses, you must enter each File Number or Call Sign as appropriate. After clicking the "SUBMIT" button, the screen will update to show all the File Numbers/Call Signs associated with the pleading. At this time, you may delete selected File Numbers/Call Signs from the page before continuing.
- The third step is to complete the *Attach File* screen to attach the pleading document. Use the drop down box to select Pleading or Confidential Pleading. The "BROWSE" button opens a file upload window where you will locate and select your pleading file. The Description field allows you to enter a brief description for the pleading. Click the "ADD ATTACHMENT" button to upload your pleading. You may submit up to thirty files for each pleading but each file must be smaller than 10 MB in size. You also have the opportunity to delete any selected file from the pleading.
- Finally, to complete your electronic pleading submission, click on the "SUBMIT PLEADING" button and the *Confirmation* screen will be displayed. The *Confirmation* screen will display your Confirmation Number as well as your entered pleadings information. You may print this page for your records by selecting the Print Page link at the top of the page and have the option of submitting another pleading or returning to the ULS website by selecting a link at the bottom of the page.

The ULS Application and License Search results will display pleadings under the ADMIN tab when a comment or reply comment has been filed. Users can view the pleading by clicking on the link for the specific comment or reply comment in the Description field. The general public will not be able to view confidential pleadings.
