WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON A PETITION FILED BY THE NORTH CAROLINA UTILITIES COMMISSION FOR AGREEMENT IN REDEFINING THE SERVICE AREA OF A RURAL TELEPHONE COMPANY IN THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA

The Wireline Competition Bureau (Bureau) seeks comment on a petition filed on April 21, 2016, by the North Carolina Utilities Commission (NCUC),¹ pursuant to section 54.207 of the Commission's rules.² Specifically, NCUC seeks the Commission's agreement with the NCUC's redefinition of certain Central Telephone Company wire centers as a separate service area or areas, specifically, the wire centers associated with the exchanges of Elkin, Hays, Mulberry, North Wilkesboro, and State Road, North Carolina.³

Section 54.207 of the Commission's rules, which implements section 214(e)(5) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended (the Act), provides that a rural telephone company's service area will be its study area "unless and until the Commission and the states, after taking into account the recommendations of a Federal-State Joint Board instituted under section 410(c) of the Act, establish a different definition of service area for such company."⁴

This public notice is required by section 54.207(c)(2) of the Commission's rules.⁵ If the Commission initiates a proceeding to consider the Petition, it must do so within 90 days of the release

date of this public notice, pursuant to the Commission's rules.⁶ If the Commission does not act on the Petition by **August 2, 2016**, the definition proposed by the NCUC will be deemed approved by the Commission and shall take effect in accordance with state procedures.⁷

Pursuant to sections 1.415 and 1.419 of the Commission's rules, interested parties may file comments on or before the dates indicated above.⁸ All pleadings are to reference **CC Docket No. 96-45.** Comments may be filed using the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System (ECFS), or by filing paper copies.⁹

The proceeding this Notice initiates shall be treated as a "permit-but-disclose" proceeding in accordance with the Commission's ex parte rules.¹¹ Persons making ex parte presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies). Persons making oral *ex parte* presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the ex *parte* presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation. If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum. Documents shown or given to Commission staff during *ex parte* meetings are deemed to be written *ex parte* presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b). In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has made available a method of electronic filing, written *ex parte* presentations and memoranda summarizing oral exparte presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (e.g., .doc, .xml, .ppt, searchable .pdf). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's ex parte rules.
