FCC ANNOUNCES APPLICANTS FOR CERTIFICATION TO PARTICIPATE IN THE NATIONAL DEAF-BLIND EQUIPMENT DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM

CG Docket No. 10-210

On August 4, 2016, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC or Commission) adopted rules to convert the National Deaf-Blind Equipment Distribution Program (NDBEDP), also known as "iCanConnect," from a pilot program to a permanent program as of July 1, 2017. Pursuant to these rules, the Commission's Consumer and Governmental Affairs Bureau (CGB), must certify a single entity for each state, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands, and the U.S. Virgin Islands, as the sole entity for that jurisdiction to administer the NDBEDP and receive reimbursement for NDBEDP activities from the TRS Fund. On February 7, 2017, CGB announced that it would accept certification applications from interested parties for a 60-day period, ending on April 7, 2017.

In accordance with the *NDBEDP Permanent Program Order*, CGB publishes this list of entities that have applied for certification to participate in the NDBEDP.⁴ This announcement puts all certification applicants on notice of competing applications.⁵

Only the entities certified to serve Virginia and Wisconsin under the NDBEDP pilot program notified CGB of such intent. These entities must comply with certain requirements set forth in the NDBEDP Permanent Program Order that are designed to ensure the continuation of NDBEDP operations in their jurisdictions, including the submission of final reimbursement claims and reports to the Commission, the transfer of data and equipment inventory to their successors, and notification of their exits from the program to consumers.
