WIRELINE COMPETITION BUREAU SEEKS COMMENT ON CHARTER COMMUNICATIONS, INC. PETITION FOR WAIVER OF RURAL DIGITAL OPPORTUNITY FUND PHASE I ELIGIBLE AREA RULES

The Wireline Competition Bureau, in coordination with the Rural Broadband Auctions Task Force and the Office of Economics and Analytics, seeks comment on a petition filed by Charter Communications, Inc. (Charter) requesting waiver of the Commission's census block eligibility criteria for the Rural Digital Opportunity Fund Phase I auction in order to exclude from eligibility census blocks in New York in which Charter will deploy broadband service to satisfy its commitments to the state.¹

Availability of Documents. Comments, reply comments, and ex parte submissions will be publicly available online via ECFS.³

Permit but Disclose Ex Parte Communications. For the purposes of the Commission's ex parte rules, each petition addressed within this public notice initiates will be treated as initiating a permit-butdisclose proceeding under the Commission's rules.⁴ Persons making ex parte presentations must file a copy of any written presentation or a memorandum summarizing any oral presentation within two business days after the presentation (unless a different deadline applicable to the Sunshine period applies).⁵ Persons making oral ex parte presentations are reminded that memoranda summarizing the presentation must (1) list all persons attending or otherwise participating in the meeting at which the ex parte presentation was made, and (2) summarize all data presented and arguments made during the presentation.⁶ If the presentation consisted in whole or in part of the presentation of data or arguments already reflected in the presenter's written comments, memoranda or other filings in the proceeding, the presenter may provide citations to such data or arguments in his or her prior comments, memoranda, or other filings (specifying the relevant page and/or paragraph numbers where such data or arguments can be found) in lieu of summarizing them in the memorandum.⁷ Documents shown or given to Commission staff during ex parte meetings are deemed to be written ex parte presentations and must be filed consistent with rule 1.1206(b).8 In proceedings governed by rule 1.49(f) or for which the Commission has made available a method of electronic filing, written ex parte presentations and memoranda summarizing oral ex parte presentations, and all attachments thereto, must be filed through the electronic comment filing system available for that proceeding, and must be filed in their native format (e.g.,.doc,.xml,.ppt, searchable.pdf). Participants in this proceeding should familiarize themselves with the Commission's ex parte rules.
