GE International Holdings acquired the AMC-23 satellite from SES Americom, Inc. on March 29, 2007.¹ The Commission had previously granted authority for the assignment of this space station license effective March 28, 2007.² By letter dated April 3, 2007, GE International Holdings notified the Commission that it had renamed the satellite "GE-23."³

I. STATUS OF SATELLITE CONSTRUCTION

The GE-23 satellite was manufactured by Alcatel Space. The GE-23 satellite was launched on December 28, 2005, commenced its intended operations at 172° E.L. on February 15, 2006, and has been in continuous operation since that date.

III. TRANSPONDER UTILIZATION
