Dear Senator Sullivan:

Thank you for your letter expressing support for the E-rate program. E-Rate is a key component of the Universal Service Fund and helps millions of students in America benefit from digital learning. That is why, four years ago, I said that "E-Rate is a program worth fighting for." A more effective E-Rate program—one that promotes better connectivity for students and library patrons alike—can be a powerful tool to help bridge the digital divide.

Unfortunately, there recently have been serious flaws in the administration of the E-Rate program—flaws regarding the application process for schools and libraries and in particular the development and roll-out of the online E-Rate Productivity Center (EPC). The project, approved by the prior administration, was supposed to cost \$19 million when USAC began implementing it in 2014. But over \$30 million has already been spent, and estimates are that the total cost may be \$60 million or greater. What's worse, too many schools and libraries have been unable to receive approval for applications filed more than a year ago, leading to project cancellations and fewer services for our nation's students and library patrons.

This is unacceptable, and it's why I recently wrote to the Universal Service Administrative Company, directing them to fix the E-Rate application process and take all steps needed to ensure that schools and libraries do not suffer because of IT failures. I have attached a copy of that letter.

I appreciate your interest in this matter and I look forward to working with you as we pursue the goal of promoting digital learning. Please let me know if I can be of any further assistance.
