Barbara,

I spoke with Kevin Harding today regarding ONE Media's proposal to file for Special Temporary Authority to demonstrate the capabilities of the Next Generation Broadcast Transmission standard in the Baltimore-Washington markets. Specifically, we plan to test a Single Frequency Network using the Channel 43 allocation in both markets.

Channel 43 for Baltimore is currently vacant. Channel 43 in Washington is an unbuilt construction permit held by Signal Above, Inc. The permittee has informed us that it has no immediate plans to build out Channel 43 and is not opposed to our test, as it is currently using Channel 6 in the DC market for other commercial purposes. At the same time, it does not want to provide consent even to the temporary experimental use of Channel 43 if that consent would in any way jeopardize its current use of Channel 6 or future use of Channel 43.

We would like to assure Signal Above that the ONE Media temporary use of Channel 43 will not in any way affect its rights to use either Channels 6 or 43 in the Washington DMA. We are simply an unrelated, third-party tester using an unoccupied channel temporarily with no intent to insert itself into the legal status of Signal Above with respect to its license for Channel 6 or permit for Channel 43.

We would appreciate a response from you agreeing that any potential grant of a STA for temporary use of Channel 43 in Washington will have no effect on the Signal Above rights to use either channels 6 or 43 in Washington. Any issues related to its use of those channels are independent from the soon-to-be filed ONE Media STA to use channels 43 in Baltimore and Washington.
