Aerial Video Systems Application for Special Temporary Authority File Number 0795-EX-ST-2024 May 24, 2024 through June 24, 2024

Narrative Explanation of Operation

Aerial Video Systems (AVS), a subsidiary of NEP Broadcast Services, is a video production company which is engaged in video and audio production for television shows, sporting events and entertainment events. AVS has been retained by Turner Sports and ESPN to provide video production services for the National Basketball Association (NBA) playoff games at various arenas specified herein during the period May 24, 2024 through June 24, 2024, but only during the times of the actual games at nine stadium venues. To do this, due to heavy use of normal Broadcast Auxiliary and Local Television Transmission Service video bandwidth channels, AVS respectfully requests a grant of Special Temporary Authority for use of the band 3350-3400 MHz to test RF cameras developed by AVS in the arenas, *indoors only, using extremely low transmitter power and low power spectral density*, during the NBA playoff basketball games, during the period specified. The facilities specified are the same as those granted to AVS during the regular NBA season. See, File No. 2015-EX-ST-2024.

All video production events during this single period will be inside the arenas at each location. AVS is a licensee in the Local Television Transmission Service and holds other licenses but the frequency bands authorized by those licenses are otherwise in use by broadcast auxiliary users in the cities in each of the venues, and additional spectrum is necessary.

AVS intends to use at each production venue several RF cameras using a maximum of 100 milliwatts of transmitter power (and less than 250 mW ERP) into an omnidirectional antenna using a 10M0FXW or 10M0D7W emission on two discrete, 10 MHz bandwidth channels in the band 3350-3400 MHz. AVS has no long-term interest in this band. It is developing equipment that could be used in the General Access portion of the CBRS band at 3650-3700 MHz or elsewhere, but that equipment is not now ready for deployment in accordance with Part 96 rules.

Video production will be terrestrial only, within the arenas, which ensures a high degree of signal attenuation. All operation within the stadiums will be under the direct control of AVS, which will ensure against any interference to any other users of the same or adjacent bands at all times during any STA operation by AVS. AVS will protect any and all United States Government spectrum use prior to or during each of the events, and should any interference arise, all AVS operation in this band will cease until resolved to the full satisfaction of the complainant.
