DESCRIPTION

The Verizon Telephone Companies (“Verizon”) are submitting tariff pages to introduce a new Contract Tariff Option (“Contract Option”) in its Tariffs F.C.C. Nos. 1, 11 and 14. With this Contract Option, the customer can receive a billing credit when the customer attains a minimum in total billed revenue (“TBR”) for certain Special Access Services (“Qualifying Services”) and meets other criteria as specified in the attached tariff pages.

This new Contract Option is filed pursuant to the Pricing Flexibility relief granted to Verizon in certain qualifying Metropolitan Statistical Areas (“MSAs”).¹ The new Contract Option is introduced as Contract Tariff Option 49 in Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, Contract Tariff Option 50 in Tariff F.C.C. No. 11, and Contract Tariff Option 24 in Tariff F.C.C. No. 14.

With this new Contract Option, TBR is aggregated across Tariffs F.C.C. Nos. 1, 11, 14 and 16, however no billing credit under this new Contract Option shall be provided or due with respect to Qualifying Services purchased under Tariff F.C.C. No. 16. Billing credits will be applied only to the Qualifying Services which are located in MSAs that have achieved Phase I or Phase II pricing flexibility.

Subject to certain restrictions as described in the attached tariff pages, where the customer achieves the minimum TBR requirement set forth in the attached tariff pages, the customer is eligible for a billing credit payable on a quarterly and yearly basis during the eight (8) year service period.

The customer is also eligible to receive a Fiber to the Cell (“FTTC”) credit and a Cell on Wheels (“COW”) and Cell on Light Truck (“COLT”) credit, each as further described in the attached tariff pages.

All billing credits and other credits are determined and calculated in accordance with the requirements specified in the attached tariff pages.

A complete description of the terms and conditions of this new Contract Option is included in the attached tariff pages.
