With this filing , SBC Advanced Solutions, Inc.(ASI) is cancelling its Tariff F.C.C. No. 2 effective October 31, 2008. Concurrent with this filing, AT&T Corp. is filing Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 which continues in its entirety all rates, terms, condition, limits, and liabilities found in SBC Advanced Solutions, Inc's Tariff F.C.C. No. 2.

On the effective date of this filing, SBC Advanced Solutions, Inc. will be merged into AT&T Corp. with no disruptions or impacts to its customers. The proposed AT&T Corp. Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, continues the same rates, terms and conditions for sub-200 Kbps frame relay service. The terms and conditions contained in the proposed tariff are the same terms and conditions that SBC Advanced Solutions, Inc. makes available to customers today on a contractual basis.
