DESCRIPTION

The Verizon Telephone Companies (“Verizon”) are submitting tariff pages to introduce a new Contract Tariff Option (“Contract Option”) in its Tariff FCC Nos. 1 and 11. With this Contract Option, the customer can receive certain discounts and credits on Qualifying Services (i.e., Special Access 1.544 Mbps (“DS1”) Services and Special Access 44.736 Mbps (“DS3”) Services) within the eligible Local Access and Transport Areas (“LATAs”) specified in the attached tariff pages. Specifically, the customer is eligible to receive (i) a discounted channel mileage rate for its Qualifying DS1 Services; (ii) a minimum annual revenue commitment (“MARC”) credit for achieving a certain minimum monthly recurring charge threshold; and (iii) an annual bonus payment, each as further described in the attached tariff pages and subject to the requirements as set forth in the attached tariff pages.

This new Contract Option is filed pursuant to the Pricing Flexibility relief granted to Verizon in certain qualifying Metropolitan Statistical Areas (“MSAs”).¹ The new Contract Option is introduced as Contract Tariff Option 60 in Tariff FCC No. 1 and Option 58 in Tariff FCC No. 11.

A complete description of the terms and conditions of this new Contract Option is included in the attached tariff pages.
