This filing is being made by Qwest in its Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, to comply with the F.C.C.'s Rules 47 C.F.R. § 61.43 that requires local exchange carriers to submit annual price cap tariff filings that propose rates for the upcoming year and make adjustments to price cap indices. This filing also complies with the F.C.C.'s Sixth Report and Order in CC Docket Nos. 96-262 and 94-1, In the Matter of Access Charge Reform; Price Cap Performance Review for Local Exchange Carriers, Report and Order in CC Docket No. 99-249, Low-Volume Long Distance Users, Eleventh Report and Order in CC Docket No. 96-45, Federal-State Joint Board on Universal Service, FCC 00-193 (CALLS Order), Order, DA 10-505, In the Matter of July 1, 2010 Annual Access Charge Tariff Filings, and its Tariff Review Plans, DA 10-506, In the Matter of Material to be Filed in Support of 2010 Annual Access Tariff Filings.

Pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 0.457 of the Commission's Rules, Qwest requests confidential treatment for Workpaper 9 (Confidential), which is included with this tariff transmittal. Workpaper 9 has been marked "**CONFIDENTIAL – Not for Public Disclosure**" because it contains competitively sensitive information. Workpaper 9 qualifies for protection and non-disclosure under Subsection (d) of § 0.457 ("Trade secrets and commercial or financial information...not routinely available for public inspection"). If the F.C.C. does not agree that Workpaper 9 is covered under § 0.457(d), then Qwest requests that this document be withheld from public inspection pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 0.459. Qwest believes it would suffer substantial competitive harm if Workpaper 9 was released to the general public. If the F.C.C. denies this request for confidential treatment under

the Standard Protective Order and Declaration for use in § 402(b) Streamlined LEC Tariff Proceedings, then Qwest requests, pursuant to § 0.459(e), that Workpaper 9 be returned. Finally, Qwest is also providing a redacted version of Workpaper 9 with this tariff transmittal.

In this filing Qwest is also updating the universal service contribution factors for the third quarter of 2010. This update applies the factor as adopted in Public Notice DA 10-1055, released June 10, 2010.

The general USF change factor has been decreased to 0.136 to reflect the third quarter 2010 charge factor.

Multiline Business USF Charge Factor

As shown in USF Workpaper 1, "Federal Universal Service Fund Charge Factor Development," the Multiline Business charge factor for each study area is calculated by dividing the Multiline Business lines subject to FCC end user charges by the total number of lines subject to PICC charges pursuant to 47 C.F.R. 69.153. This ratio is multiplied by the third Quarter 2010 USF Factor to determine the appropriate Multiline Business USF Charge Factor.

Centrex USF Charge Factor

As shown in USF Workpaper 1, "Federal Universal Service Fund Charge Factor Development," the Centrex USF Charge Factor is one-ninth of the Multiline Business USF Charge Factor.

Qwest is also adding language in Section 7, Private Line Transport Service, to allow customers to provide their own Environmental Cabinets and Relay Racks. This change is being made at the request of customers who wish to terminate service in their own equipment.

Supporting information discussed under Sections 61.38 and 61.49 of the Commission's Rules is included in this transmittal letter and the attached Description and Justification.

As part of this filing Qwest is also adding twenty-two new special construction cases in its Tariff F.C.C. No. 2, Special Construction. Supporting information for these cases, discussed under Section 61.38 of the Commission's Rules, is included in the attached Special Construction Description and Justification (D&J).

The Tariff filing fee in the amount of \$815.00 is being paid by credit card through the appropriate entries in Section E of the ETFS generated Form 159.
