

## ACCESS SERVICE

7. Special Access Service7.1 General

Special Access Service provides a transmission path to connect customer designated premises\*, either directly or through a Telephone Company Hub where bridging or multiplexing functions are performed, or to connect a customer designated premises and a WATS Serving Office. Special Access Service includes all exchange access not utilizing Telephone Company end office switches.

The connections provided by Special Access Service can be either analog or digital. Analog connections are differentiated by spectrum and bandwidth. Digital connections are differentiated by bit rate.

The provision of Special Access in all situations is dependent upon the availability of Telephone Company plant and equipment.

The rates and charges in this section apply to all special access customers served by the Telephone Company, except for customers in the pricing flexibility Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) listed in Section 22.3 following. The rates and charges for special access customers in the pricing flexibility MSAs are set forth in Section 22.5 following.

\* Telephone Company Centrex CO-like switches are considered to be customer premises for purposes of this tariff.

There are eight types of channels used to provide Special Access Services. Each type has its own characteristics. All are subdivided by one or more of the following:

- Transmission specifications,
- Bandwidth,
- Speed (i.e., bit rate),
- Spectrum

The Customer can order a basic channel and select from a list of available transmission parameters, interface combinations, and optional features to design a channel which meets the Customer's specific communications needs.

For purposes of ordering channels, each has been identified as a type of Special Access Service. However, such identification is not intended to limit a customer's use of the channel nor to imply that the channel is limited to a particular use.

Following is a brief description of each type of channel:

Voice Grade - A channel for the transmission of analog signals within an approximate bandwidth of 300-3000 Hz.

Program Audio - A channel for the transmission of audio signals. The nominal frequency bandwidths are from 300 Hz to 2500 Hz, from 200 to 3500 Hz, from 100 to 5000 Hz, from 50 to 8000 Hz, or from 50 to 15000 Hz.

Video - A channel for the transmission of a standard 525 line/60 field monochrome or National Television Systems Committee color video signal and up to four associated 5 or 15 kHz audio signals. The bandwidth for a video channel is either 30 Hz to 4.5 MHz or 30 Hz to 6.6 Mhz.

Digital Data - A channel for the digital transmission of synchronous serial data at rates of 2.4, 4.8, 9.6, 19.2, 56.0 or 64.0 kbps.

High Capacity - A channel for the transmission of isochronous serial digital data at rates of 1.544 (DS1) or 44.736 (DS3) Mbps.

Shared SONET Ring - A SONET-based shared ring with bandwidth capacities of 1.544 Mbps (DS1) and 44.736 Mbps (DS3).

Gateway SONET Ring - A SONET-based dedicated ring with bandwidth capacities of 622.08 Mbps (OC12) and 2488.32 Mbps (OC48).

Ethernet Virtual Private Line – A high speed data transport service that provides the ability to order Ethernet service where a single customer can support multiple applications with varying Quality of Service at transport speeds of 10 Mbps, 30 Mbps, 100 Mbps, 500 Mbps and 1000 Mbps (1 Gbps).

Detailed descriptions of each of the channel types are provided in 7.2 following.

The customer also has the option of ordering high capacity facilities (e.g., 1.544 or 44.736 Mbps) to a Telephone Company Hub for multiplexing to individual channels of a lower capacity or bandwidth. Descriptions of the types of multiplexing available at the Hubs, as well as the number of individual channels which may be derived from each type of facility are set forth in 7.2 following. Descriptions of the optional features and functions available are also set forth in 7.2 following.

For example, a customer may order a 1.544 Mbps facility from a customer designated premises to a Telephone Company Hub. The 1.544 Mbps facility may be multiplexed at the same or a different Hub to Voice Grade channels or may be extended to other customer designated premises. Optional features may be added to either the 1.544 Mbps or the Voice Grade Channels.

7.1.2 Rate Categories

There are three basic rate elements which apply to Special Access Service:

- Channel Terminations (described in 7.1.2(A) following)
- Channel Mileage (described in 7.1.2(B) following)
- Optional Features and Functions (described in 7.1.2 (C) following)

(A) Channel Termination

The Channel Termination rate category provides for the communications path between a customer designated premises and the serving wire center or WATS Serving Office of that premises. Included as part of the Channel Termination is a standard channel interface arrangement which defines the technical characteristics associated with the type of facilities to which the access service is to be connected at the point of termination (POT) and the type of signaling capability if any. The signaling capability itself is provided as a part of this rate category. One Channel Termination charge applies per customer designated premises at which the channel is terminated. Channel Termination charges for DS1 and DS3 High Capacity Services may vary based on distance, as set forth in 7.5.8(A) following. Special Access Service used in connection with Switched Access service is provided as set forth in Section 6.1.1.

7. Special Access Service (Cont'd)7.1 General (Cont'd)7.1.2 Rate Categories (Cont'd)(B) Channel Mileage

The Channel Mileage rate category provides for the end office equipment and the transmission channel between the serving wire centers associated with two Customer designated premises, between a serving wire center associated with a Customer designated premises and a Telephone Company hub, between two Telephone Company hubs or between a WATS Serving Office and a Customer serving wire center when the two are not co-located. Channel Mileage rates are made up of the Channel Mileage Facility rate and the Channel Mileage Termination rate. Channel Mileage charges are set forth in Section 7.5.

(1) Channel Mileage Facility (Per Mile)

The Channel Mileage Facility rate recovers the cost for the transmission path which extends between the Telephone Company serving wire centers and/or hub(s) and includes primarily outside plant used to provide the facility.

(2) Channel Mileage Termination (Fixed)

The Channel Mileage Termination rate recovers the cost for end office equipment associated with terminating the facility (i.e., basic circuit equipment and terminations at serving wire centers and hubs). The Telephone Company applies a 50% billing percentage to the channel mileage fixed rate on jointly owned circuits, and applies 100% on wholly owned circuits. When the Channel Mileage Facility is zero (i.e., collocated serving wire centers), neither the Channel Mileage Facility rate nor the Channel Mileage Termination rate will apply.

Optional Features and Functions may be added to a Special Access service to improve its quality or utility to meet the Customer's specific communications requirements. These are not necessarily identifiable with specific equipment, but rather represent the end result in terms of performance characteristics which may be obtained. These characteristics may be obtained by using various combination of equipment. Examples of Optional Features and Functions that are available include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Conditioning
- Bridging
- NetPoint (ISDN PRI Functionality)

Descriptions for each of the available Optional Features and Functions are set forth in 7.2 following.

There are three types of service configurations over which Special Access Services are provided: two-point service, multipoint service and extension service.

(A) Two-Point Service

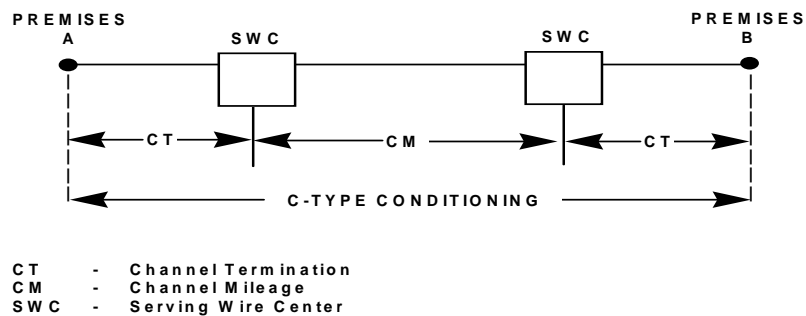
A two-point service connects two customer designated premises, either on a directly connected basis or through a Hub where multiplexing functions are performed, or a customer designated premises and a WATS Serving Office. All types of Special Access Service may be provided as two-point service.

Applicable rate elements are:

- Channel Terminations
- Channel Mileage (as applicable)
- Optional Features and Functions (when applicable)

In addition, a Special Access Surcharge as set forth in 7.4.2 following may be applicable.

The following diagram depicts a two-point Voice Grade service connecting two customer designated premises located 15 miles apart. The service is provided with C-Type Conditioning.

Applicable rate elements are:

- Channel Terminations (2 applicable)
- Channel Mileage (1 Termination and 15 Facility)
- C-Type Conditioning Optional Feature

(B) Multipoint Service

Multipoint service connects three or more customer designated premises through a Telephone Company Hub. There is no limitation on the number of mid-links available with multipoint service. However, when more than three mid-links are provided in tandem, the quality of the service may be degraded. A mid-link is a channel between Hubs (i.e., bridging locations). Only certain types of Special Access Service are provided as multipoint service. These are so designated in the Service Descriptions set forth in 7.2 following.

Multipoint service utilizing a customized technical specifications package as set forth in 7.2 following will be provided when technically possible. If the Telephone Company determines that the requested characteristics for a multipoint service are not compatible, the customer will be advised and given the opportunity to change the order.

When ordering, the customer will specify the desired bridging Hub(s) selected from the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. Tariff F.C.C. No. 4. This tariff identifies the type(s) of bridging functions which are available and the serving wire centers at which they are available.

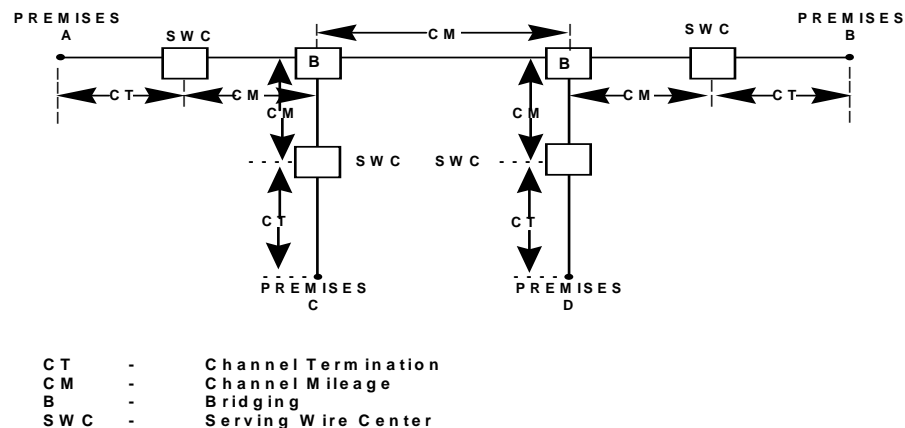

Applicable Rate Elements are:

- Channel Terminations (one per customer designated premises)
- Channel Mileage (as applicable between each designated customer premises and the Hub, and between Hubs)
- Bridging
- Additional Optional Features (when applicable)

In addition, the Special Access Surcharge as set forth in 7.4.2 following may be applicable.

Example: Voice Grade multipoint service connecting four customer premises via two customer specified bridging hubs.

Applicable rate elements are:

- Channel Terminations (4 applicable)
- Channel Mileage (5 sections, Termination and Facility as appropriate)
- Bridging (6 applicable, i.e., each bridge port)

(C) Extension Service

Special Access Service utilized for connection with Feature Group A Switched Access Service is available with extensions, i.e., additional terminations of the service at different building(s) in the same or a different exchange. Feature Group A extensions within the same exchange are charged for under the Telephone Company's local and/or general exchange service tariffs. Feature Group A extensions in different exchanges and Voice Grade extensions in the same or different exchanges are charged for as Special Access Service. The rate elements which apply are: Voice Grade Channel Termination, Channel Mileage, if applicable, and Voice Bridging, if applicable. All appropriate monthly rates and nonrecurring charges set forth in 7.5.2 following will apply. Such extensions are ordered as set forth in 5.2 preceding.

Alternate use occurs when a Customer uses a service for different types of transmission at different times. The Customer may transfer from one type of operation to another at will. A Customer may use transmission services in any privately beneficial way but, where technical or engineering changes are required to effectuate an alternate use, charges set forth in Section 13 of this tariff may be applicable.

The arrangement required to transfer the service from one operation to the other (i.e., the transfer relay and control leads) will be rated and provided on an individual case basis and filed in Section 12, Specialized Service or Arrangements. The customer will pay the stated tariff rates for the Access Service rate elements for the service ordered (i.e., Channel Terminations, Channel Mileage [as applicable] and Optional Features [if any]).

Alternate uses will be allowed provided that such use meets the technical protection parameters as set forth in Section 7.2.

7.1.5 Special Facilities Routing

A customer may request that the facilities used to provide Special Access Service be specially routed. The regulations, rates and charges for Special Facilities Routing (i.e., Avoidance, Diversity and Cable-Only) are set forth in Section 11 following.

At the request of the customer, the Telephone Company will provide to the customer the make-up of the facilities and services provided under this tariff as Special Access Service to aid the customer in designing its overall service. This information will be provided in the form of a Design Layout Report. The Design Layout Report will be provided to the customer at no charge, and will be reissued or updated whenever these facilities are materially changed.

7.1.7 Acceptance Testing

At no additional charge, the Telephone Company will, at the customer's request, cooperatively test, at the time of installation, the following parameters:

- (A) For Voice Grade Services (VG): loss, 3-tone slope, d.c. continuity and operational signaling, where technically appropriate. Where a four-wire voice transmission interface provides two-wire voice transmission, (i.e., there is a four-wire to two-wire conversion), balance (equal level echo path loss) will also be tested. Additionally, C-notched noise and C-message noise tests will be provided where technically appropriate, as well as frequency response, harmonic distortion, phase jitter, impulse noise and delay distortion for all analog facilities.
- (B) All other Special Access Services will be tested to the performance parameters specified for the individual services.

Additional tests may be ordered as set forth in 13.1.10 following. Charges for these additional tests are set forth in 13.2 and 13.3.1(A).

7.2 Service Descriptions

For the purposes of ordering, there are eight categories of Special Access Service. These are:

Voice Grade	(VG)
Program Audio	(AP)
Video	(TV)
Digital Data	(DA)
High Capacity	(HC)
Shared SONET Ring	(SSRS)
Gateway SONET Ring	(GSRS)
Ethernet Virtual Private Line	

Each service consists of a basic channel to which a technical specifications package (customized or predefined), channel interface(s) and, when desired, optional features and functions are added to construct the service desired by the customer. Each of the components of the service is described in this section.

Customized technical specifications packages will be provided where technically feasible. If the Telephone Company determines that the requested parameter specifications are not compatible, the customer will be advised and given the opportunity to change the order.

When a customized channel is ordered the customer will be notified whether Additional Labor Charges apply. In such cases, the customer will be given an estimate of the hours to be billed before any further action is taken on the order.

The channel description specifies the characteristics of the basic channel and indicates whether the channel is provided between customer designated premises, between a customer designated premises and a Telephone Company Hub where bridging or multiplexing functions are performed, or between a customer designated premises and a WATS Serving Office.

Information pertaining to the technical specifications packages indicates the transmission parameters that are available with each package. This information is displayed in a matrix with the transmission parameters listed down the left side and the packages listed across the top. Each package is identified by a code, e.g., VGC. The first two letters of the code indicate the category of Special Access Service to which the parameters are applicable. These two letter codes are shown above in parentheses following the category of Special Access Service. The letter "C" following the two letter code indicates the technical specifications package for a customized service. A numeric or alpha-numeric designation following the two letter code indicates the specific predefined package. For a customized service, the customer may select any parameters available with that category of service as long as the parameters are compatible. When appropriate, the Technical Reference which contains detailed specifications for the parameters is shown following the matrix.

Channel interfaces at each point of termination on a two-point service may be symmetrical or asymmetrical. On a multipoint service they may also be symmetrical or asymmetrical. However, communications can only be provided between points of termination with compatible channel interfaces. Only certain channel interfaces are compatible. These are set forth in 7.3.5 following in a combination format.

Only certain channel interface combinations are available with the predefined technical specifications packages. These are delineated in the Technical References set forth in Section 7.2. When a customized channel is requested, all channel interface combinations available with the specified type of service are available with the customized channel.

The optional features and functions available with each type of Special Access Service are also described in this section. The information indicates with which technical specifications packages the optional features and functions are available. Such information is displayed in a matrix with the optional feature or function listed down the left side and the technical specifications package listed across the top.

The Telephone Company will maintain existing transmission specifications on services installed prior to the effective date of this tariff, except that the existing services with performance specifications exceeding the standard listed in this provision will be maintained at the performance levels specified in this tariff. All services installed after the effective date of this tariff will conform to the transmission specification standards contained in this tariff or in the following Technical Reference Publication for each category of service:

A Voice Grade (VG) channel is a channel which provides voice frequency transmission capability in the nominal frequency range of 300 to 3000 Hz and may be terminated two-wire or four-wire.

The following channel interfaces for Voice Grade service do not require signaling capability: AH, DA, DB, DD, DE, DS, NO, PR and TF.

The following channel interfaces for Voice Grade service require signaling capability: AB, AC, CT, DX, DY, EA, EB, EC, EX, GO, GS, LA, LB, LC, LO, LR, LS, RV and SF.

Compatible channel interfaces are set forth in 7.3.5(B) following.

(D) Optional Features and Functions(1) Central Office Bridging Capability

- Voice Bridging (two-wire or four-wire): provides for the parallel connection of one voice circuit to another without interrupting the integrity or continuity of the first.
- Data Bridging (two-wire or four-wire): provides for the parallel connection of one data circuit to another without interrupting the integrity or continuity of the first.
- Telephoto Bridging (two-wire or four-wire): provides for the parallel connection of one Telephoto circuit to another without interrupting the integrity or continuity of the first.

Loopback Capability allows transmission tests of circuits to be performed from the serving central office to the customer premises without the assistance of personnel at the customer premises.

(4) Conditioning

Conditioning provides more specific transmission characteristics for Voice Grade services.

More stringent specifications than those provided with C-Type conditioning are available separately for attenuation distortion and envelope delay distortion. The customer has the option of ordering Improved Attenuation Distortion and/or Improved Envelope Delay Distortion in lieu of C-Type conditioning.

2. DCCS offers customers with fluctuating transmission requirements the ability to more efficiently utilize their networks by changing designated terminations without circuit changes.
3. DCCS customers may elect to merge various combinations of individual voice grade circuits (64 kbps DS0 channels) into DS1 (1.544 Mbps) circuits.
4. The subrate multiplexing\* options offered with DCCS allow DS0 channels to be divided into channels of even less capacity. One 64 kbps DS0 channel can be divided into twenty channels, each having 2.4 kbps capacity; ten channels, each having 4.8 kbps capacity; or five channels, each having 9.6 kbps capacity.
5. Individual 64 kbps DS0 channels can be bridged via an optional bridging arrangement within the digital cross-connect system. Each bridging arrangement

The Telephone Company will perform any required maintenance or software upgrades in a maintenance window that is anticipated to minimize disruption of customer service and activity. The Telephone Company will provide advance notice of all scheduled maintenance.

When the Telephone Company is required to perform maintenance to the network as a result of unexpected events, prior notification may not be possible. However, the customer will be notified upon completion of the required maintenance.

No credit allowance for NetPoint<sup>sm</sup> charges will be provided for interruptions required to perform the maintenance or software upgrades.

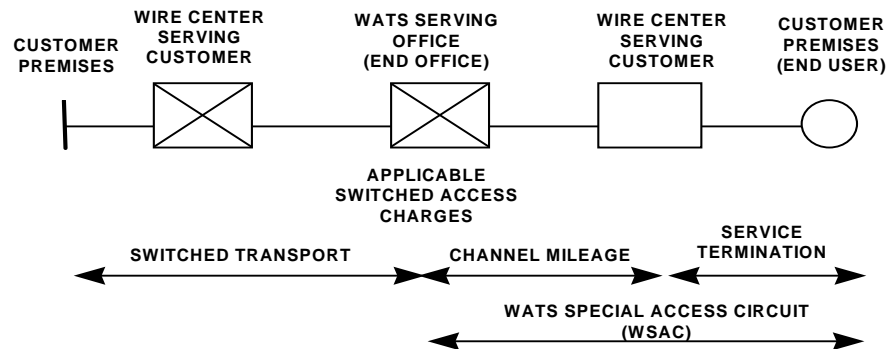

A special access service utilized for connection with a switched access service implemented as a voice grade dedicated communications path between the customer's end user and a WATS Serving Office (WSO) equipped with Feature Groups A, B, C or D service, together, form the functional parts that are the major building blocks of the WATS\* service. Switched access optional arrangements are available as set forth in Section 6.3. Both of these functional elements are necessary to provide service from the customer's end user to the customer's designated premises.

A WATS special access circuit (WSAC) may be provided as an originating only, terminating only, or two way (originating and terminating) service, at the option of the customer. If a WSO is not capable of implementing a state-mandated restriction, the WSAC will be extended free of charge to the nearest WSO capable of performing the necessary function.



\* Use of the Terms "WATS" and/or "WATS like" is descriptive only and is not intended to restrict provision of a WSAC to a specific type of service.

A WATS Special Access Circuit (WSAC) is comprised of a Channel Termination between the customer's end user serving wire center and the customer's end user premises as specified in Section 7.1.2(A). If the WSO and the end user's serving wire center are not the same, Channel Mileage as specified in Section 7.1.2(B) preceding is applicable from the end user's serving wire center to the WSO.

The transmission path is offered as either effective two-wire, effective four-wire, or a high capacity access connection. This service is provided with rotary dial or dual tone multi-frequency address signaling, and with either loop start or ground start signaling. Additionally, other optional features such as improved return loss can be provided.

(C) Voice Grade Service Restrictions

When a WSAC, as described in (B) preceding, is used for multi-jurisdictional access, and when the Telephone Company's intrastate tariff provides for customer billing for these facilities, the Telephone Company will exempt the customer from the intrastate charges related to the WSAC and channel mileage where applicable. All calls carried over a special access line used in conjunction with common switching optional features for multi-jurisdictional access will be passed to the customer for completion except when state restrictions apply or when the end user voluntarily uses a multiple carrier access code (assuming 101XXXX dialing has not been restricted by the customer).

Shared SONET Ring Service (SSRS) provides dedicated bandwidth capacity over self healing ring topology. The shared network is in a SONET-equipped ring architecture designed to provide inherent end office to end user customer premises diversity as well as alternative central office routing. SSRS will provide 50 millisecond protection switching to assure 100 percent availability of the services on the ring. SSRS supports bandwidth capacities of 1.544 Mbps (DS1) and 44.736 Mbps (DS3) with an electrical interface.

SSRS is available in the following Telephone Company serving areas:

Maitland/Winter Park, Florida

(B) Service Components(1) Ring Connection

The ring connection provides the customer with access on and off the SSRS. The ring connection includes a Telephone Company provided fiber optic terminal located on the customer premises, which constitutes a node on the SSRS. Each node shares network traffic with all other fiber optic terminal nodes from all customers subscribing to a SSRS. If a customer elects not to utilize a shared node facility, the customer can originate and terminate traffic off the SSRS. In such circumstances, special access charges as set forth in this Section and/or expanded interconnection charges as set forth in Section 17 following will apply for facilities provisioned to connect the customer to the SSRS. Gateway SONET Ring Service (GSRS) is a dedicated, high capacity network designed to provide increased reliability and functionality via a self-healing ring topology between a customer designated location and Telephone Company central offices where facilities are available. When a customer orders GSRS, the customer and the Telephone Company will work cooperatively to plan, engineer, provision and manage the SONET ring service. The customer must convert existing circuits within a mutually agreed upon timeframe with the Telephone Company, not to exceed 18 months from the date of conversion of the first customer.

GSRS is provided for a period of three or five years, and is available at customer aggregation locations which terminate 337 or greater DS1 equivalents. If the total on-net and off-net circuit quantities terminated fall below 337, the customer will be billed for the 337 minimum commitment level at the appropriate DS1 end user connection rate set forth in Section 7.5.13 following. These charges will be assessed 90 days after the Telephone Company provides written notification to the customer about the shortfall. In determining the level of service a customer has at an aggregation location, each DS3 will represent 28 DS1 equivalents.

(B) Service Components(1) Entrance Ring Connection

The Entrance Ring Connection (ERC) is the primary aggregation point of the customer's traffic to or from the Telephone Company's interoffice network. ERCs are provided using an optical interface and will be provided with or without Telephone Company provided terminal

ERCs provide for the connection of two, three or four nodes via a dedicated SONET ring as described following:

- (a) Basic Entrance Ring Connection - provides a two node ring by connecting the customer's location to a single Telephone Company central office which is part of the existing interoffice facility ring using diverse routing.
- (b) Enhanced Entrance Ring Connection - provides a three node ring by connecting a single customer location to two Telephone Company central offices which are part of the existing interoffice facility rings.

Existing GSRS customers will not be subject to minimum commitment levels, and may add, remove or rearrange on-net and off-net connections associated with existing entrance ring connections through the end of the customer's committed service period. The sum total of the transport capacity associated with the EUC may not exceed the capacity of the ERC. End users will be connected to the interoffice facility ring via an on-net or off-net configuration as described following:

- (a) On-Net Connection - provides end user premises SONET Ring connectivity via a ring or point-to-point to a Telephone Company central office which is part of the interoffice facility ring. This connection can be SONET or asynchronous. On-net central offices are identified in the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. Tariff F.C.C. No. 4.
- (b) Off-Net Connection - provides for the end user to be served by a Telephone Company central office which is not part of the interoffice facility ring. This connection can be SONET or asynchronous with connectivity to the closest on-net Telephone Company central office. The Telephone Company will determine and provide the highest level of connection to an end user premises based on existing facilities.

\* Gateway SONET Ring Service (GSRS) is limited to existing customers as of June 1, 2002. Existing GSRS customers will not be subject to minimum commitment levels, and may add, remove or rearrange on-net and off-net connections associated with existing entrance ring connections through the end of the customer's committed service period. Existing GSRS customers may convert to equal or higher level tariffed services offered by the Telephone Company prior to the end of the committed service period without incurring termination liability charges. At the expiration of the committed service period, GSRS customers must convert to other tariffed services or discontinue service.

Once the customer has established GSRS as set forth in (A) preceding, non-Gateway circuits may be rolled onto the Gateway network for connection to the ERC. The customer will be billed the applicable special access rates as set forth in section 7.5 following for the non-Gateway circuits connecting to the GSRS ERC.

Ethernet Virtual Private Line (EVPL) service provides the ability to order Ethernet service where a single customer connection can support multiple applications with varying Quality of Service (QoS). EVPL is available at transport speeds of: 10 Mbps, 100 Mbps and 1000 Mbps (1 Gbps).

EVPL is provided on a monthly basis, under a Term Discount Plan for periods of three or five years as set forth in 7.4.20(C) following or under a Fixed Rate Term Plan for a period of seven years as set forth in 7.4.20(D) following. When a customer orders EVPL, the customer and the Telephone Company will work cooperatively to plan, engineer, provision and manage the EVPL circuits. EVPL is only available where facilities and operating conditions exist.

EVPL provides customer capabilities to support different Quality of Service (QoS) (i.e., Gold, Silver and Best Effort) as described in (5) following over the same connection and offers customers increased flexibility to match bandwidth to their real needs for voice, data and video applications on each connection. The customer orders the portion of their EVPL bandwidth that will be allocated for each quality of service.

For each EVPL, the customer's bandwidth will be rate limited or policed to a fixed speed for each QoS level specified in the QoS profile selected for the Ethernet Virtual Connection (EVC).

EVPL service is available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week, except for preventive maintenance. Due to the nature of EVPL it will be necessary to perform preventive maintenance and software updates. This will mean that the EVPL service will be unavailable during the period of time when preventive maintenance is being performed. The Telephone Company will provide notice to customers of such maintenance.

(1) User to Network (UNI) Port Connection

The User to Network (UNI) Port Connection is the physical interface or port that is the demarcation between the customer and the service provider. The UNI Port Connection is always provided by the service provider. The UNI Port Connection in a Carrier Ethernet Network (CEN) is a physical Ethernet Interface at operating speeds of 10 Mbps, 100 Mbps and 1000 Mbps (1 Gbps).

(2) Network to Network (NNI) Port Connection

The Network to Network (NNI) Port Connection is the interface between distinct CENs operated by one or more customers. The NNI Port Connection is available at operating speeds of 10 Mbps, 100 Mbps and 1000 Mbps (1 Gbps).

EVPL channel mileage charges apply to EVPL service based on the service speed and when the total distance associated with the data channel exceeds 20 miles between Telephone Company serving wire centers. EVPL channel mileage provides transport between two Telephone Company serving wire centers. Air mileage is measured using V&H coordinates between the Telephone Company serving wire centers. The EVPL channel mileage rate element will be applied on a per mile basis for each mile exceeding the first 20 miles of transport.

(4) Ethernet Virtual Connection (EVC)

The EVC connects two or more customer UNI port connections. The EVC prevents data transfer between locations that are not part of the same EVC. The EVC is available at speeds of 10 Mbps, 20 Mbps, 30 Mbps, 40 Mbps, 50 Mbps, 70 Mbps, 100 Mbps, 200 Mbps, 300 Mbps, 400 Mbps, 500 Mbps, 700 Mbps and 1000 Mbps (1 Gbps).

EVC reconfigurations performed by the core network under normal operating conditions should occur without packet loss. An EVC is capable of interconnecting with other EVCs of equal bandwidth in the same metropolitan area.

Two EVCs between the same two end points may be purchased by the customer in a configuration utilizing different switching locations for each EVC in order to provide a level of network diversity. In the event of interruption of the network, recovery of at least one EVC will be re-established and data flow will be restored in <50 ms.

(5) Quality of Service

The Quality of Service (QoS) is the ability to provide different priority to the various applications of EVPL in order to guarantee a certain level of performance to a data flow. The QoS is available at speeds of 10 Mbps, 20 Mbps, 30 Mbps, 40 Mbps, 50 Mbps, 70 Mbps, 100 Mbps, 200 Mbps, 300 Mbps, 400 Mbps, 500 Mbps, 700 Mbps and 1000 Mbps (1 Gbps) and is available in 3 different priority levels described following:

- Gold: The Gold QoS is supported by a low latency queue. The Low Latency Queuing (LLQ) feature in the Ethernet network is used for support of real-time service and is configured for strict priority queuing allowing latency sensitive applications, such as voice, to be sent first. Gold QoS will be marked for expedited handling within the EVPL network.

- Silver: The Silver QoS supports interactive video applications. The Silver QoS is policed to a maximum bandwidth.
- Best Effort: This QoS is the default QoS for other traffic that is not defined as Gold or Silver. Traffic that does not match any other QoS will be mapped as Best Effort. Traffic with the Best Effort QoS will have the lowest priority on the network and will support lower priority data applications, such as email and file transfer protocol (FTP).

EVPL reporting is available to customers who purchase the Gold or Silver QoS EVPL service. EVPL reporting allows customers to view their EVPL network via the use of a web interface and secure connection. EVPL reporting provides alarm surveillance, service level agreement reporting and performance report for the various network components that comprise the customer's EVPL network.

For each EVPL arrangement, the customer must decide the mix of applications that will be supported on that EVPL, the QoS mix that the EVPL must support and the bandwidth to be assigned for each QoS. The customer's bandwidth will be limited to the fixed speed associated with each QoS level. Therefore, total bandwidth available to support transmission of a specific QoS will depend upon the size of the customer's EVPL and the specific QoS bandwidth the customer selected for that EVPL.

A customer may select different QoS profiles for different EVPL connections that share the same network LAN, or EVPL network arrangement. However, technical limitations exist that limit the total number of different QoS profiles that can be utilized in a single EVPL network arrangement.

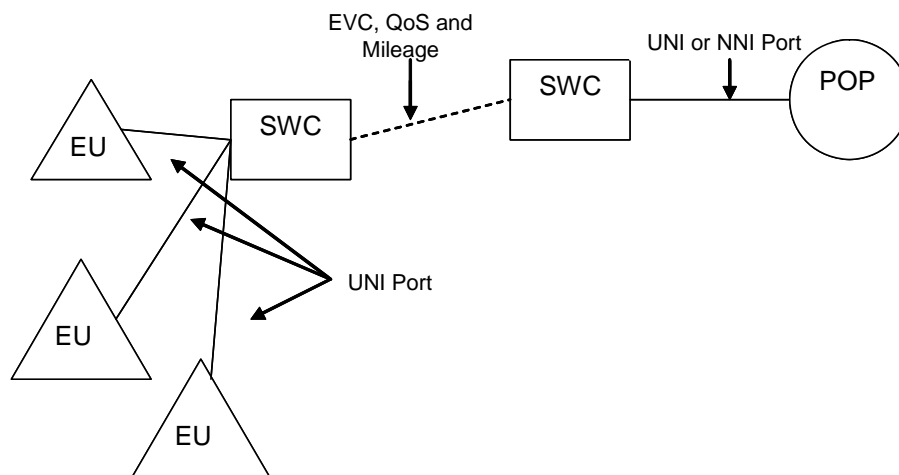
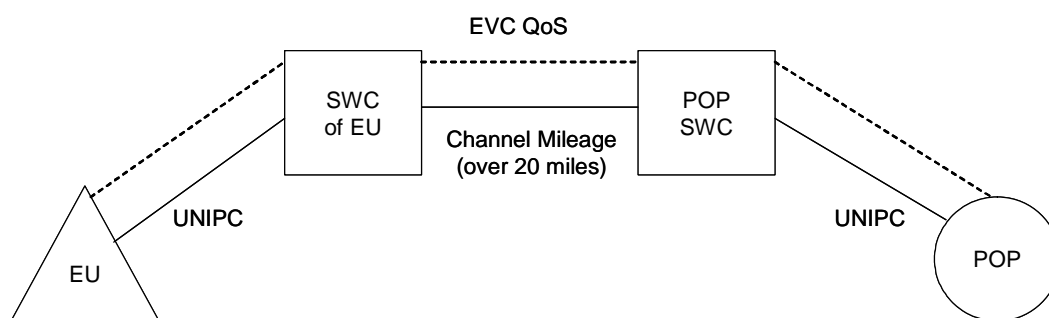

This section contains the specific regulations governing the rates and charges that apply for Special Access Service.

7.4.1 Types of Rates and Charges

There are four types of rates and charges. These are monthly rates, daily rates, nonrecurring charges, and zone density charges. The rates and charges are described as follows:

(A) Monthly Rates

Monthly rates are flat recurring rates that apply each month or fraction thereof that a Special Access Service is provided. For billing purposes, each month is considered to have 30 days.

(B) Daily Rates

Daily rates are flat recurring rates that apply to each 24 hour period or fraction thereof that a Program Audio or Video Special Access Service is provided for part-time or occasional use. For purposes of applying daily rates, the 24 hour period is not limited to a calendar day.

The application of daily rates during a consecutive 30 day period will be capped at an amount equal to the monthly rate.

Nonrecurring charges are one-time charges that apply for specific work activity (i.e., installation or change to an existing service). The Telephone Company does not apply nonrecurring charges to the channel mileage (fixed or per mile) elements. When service is jointly provided under the Single Bill Method of Multiple Company (Interconnection Point) Billing, the nonrecurring charges are applicable to all nonrecurring functions in the provision of Special Access Service. Under the Multiple Bill Method, the nonrecurring charges are applicable only when the nonrecurring function occurs within the Telephone Company's territory. The types of nonrecurring charges that apply for Special Access Service are: installation of service, installation of optional features and functions, and service rearrangements.

Nonrecurring charges apply for the installation of some of the optional features and functions available with Special Access Service. The charge applies whether the feature or function is installed coincident with the initial installation of service or at any time subsequent to the installation of the service.

The optional features and functions for which nonrecurring charges apply are set forth in 7.5.2, 7.5.3, 7.5.7 and 7.5.8 following.

Service rearrangements are changes to existing (installed) services which do not result in either a change in the minimum period requirements as set forth in 5.2.6(E) preceding or a change in the physical location of the point of termination at a customer designated premises. Changes in the physical location of the point of the termination are treated as moves and are described and charged for as set forth in 7.4.5 following.

The nonrecurring charges associated with upgrades in capacity (i.e., multiple DS0s converting to DS1s or multiple DS1s converting to DS3s) will not apply when the customer maintains the same customer premises location. Requests to add or change optional features will be subject to the nonrecurring charges associated with the features requested.

The charge to the customer for the service rearrangement is dependent on whether the change is administrative only in nature or involves actual physical change to the service.

Administrative changes will be made without charge(s) to the customer. Such changes require the continued provision and billing of the Access Service to the same entity (i.e., customer remains responsible for the Access Service). Administrative changes are as follows:

- Change of customer name (i.e., the customer of record does not change but rather the customer of record changes its name—e.g., AT&T-Long Lines to AT&T Communications),
- Change of customer or customer's end user premises address when the change of address is not a result of a physical relocation of equipment,
- Change in billing data (name, address, or contact name or telephone number)
- Change of agency authorization,
- Change of customer circuit identification,
- Change of billing account number,
- Change of customer test line number,
- Change of customer or customer's end user contact name or telephone number, and

Zone density charges are applicable only to DS1 and DS3 special access services provided at the Telephone Company designated exchanges set forth in Section 7.4.10 following. Zone density charges are flat recurring rates that apply each month or fraction thereof that a special access service is provided. For billing purposes, each month is considered to have 30 days.

7.4.2 Surcharge for Special Access Service(A) General

In addition to the rates and charges described in 7.4.1 preceding, there is a monthly surcharge that applies to Special Access Service. The Special Access Surcharge compensates the Telephone Company for use of the local exchange network when Special Access Service is connected to a PBX or equivalent device which is capable of interconnecting the Special Access Service with local exchange service.

The Telephone Company will automatically bill the surcharge on each Special Access Service installed irrespective of whether the interconnection capability exists in the customer's premises equipment or in a Centrex-CO type switch unless written certification is received from the customer certifying exemption status as set forth in (B) following.

(C) Exemption Certification

- (1) Special Access Services which are terminated as set forth in (B) preceding will be exempted from the Special Access Surcharge if the customer provides the Telephone Company with a written notification certifying exemption. - (2) If written certification is not received at the time the Special Access Service is obtained, the surcharge will be applied. Exempt status will become effective on the certification date indicated by the customer, subject to the regulations in (D) following.
- (3) The exemption certification is to be provided by the customer ordering the service. The certification must be signed by the customer or authorized representative and include the category of exemption, as set forth in (B) preceding, for each termination, and the date which the exemption is effective.
- (4) The customer shall also notify the Telephone Company when an exempted Special Access Service is changed or reterminated such that the exemption is no longer applicable.
- (5) The Telephone Company will work cooperatively with the customer to resolve any questions regarding the exemption certification. In addition, the Telephone Company may withhold exemption of the service until the questions are resolved.

(D) Crediting the Surcharge

The Telephone Company will cease billing the Special Access Surcharge when certification is received that the Special Access Service has become exempt from the surcharge, as set forth in (B) preceding. If the status of the Special Access Service was changed prior to receipt of the exemption certification, the Telephone Company will credit the customer's account, not to exceed ninety (90) days, based on the effective date of the change specified by the customer in the letter of certification.

The mileage to be used to determine the monthly rate for the Channel Mileage Facility rate element is calculated on the airline distance between the serving wire centers involved, i.e., the serving wire centers associated with two Customer designated premises, a serving wire center associated with a Customer designated premises and a Telephone Company hub, or two Telephone Company hubs or between the serving wire center associated with a Customer designated premises, and a WATS serving office. The serving wire center associated with a Customer designated premises is the serving wire center from which the Customer designated premises would normally obtain dial tone. The V & H coordinates method is used to determine mileage. This method is explained in the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. Tariff F.C.C. No. 4. If the method results in fractional miles, the fractional miles are rounded up to the nearest whole number before determining the rate to be billed. The serving wire center and hub V & H coordinates are also included in that tariff. When hubs are involved, mileage is computed and rates applied separately for each section of the Channel Mileage, i.e., Customer designated premises serving wire center to hub, hub to hub and/or hub to Customer designated premises serving wire center. However, when any service routed through a hub for purposes other than Customer specified bridging or multiplexing (e.g., the Telephone Company chooses to so route for test access purposes), rates will be applied only to the distance calculated between the serving wire centers associated with the Customer designated premises.

A customer has the option of ordering Voice Grade service or High Capacity services to facility hub for channelizing to individual services requiring lower capacity facilities (e.g., Voice, Program Audio, etc.).

A Hub is a Telephone Company designated serving wire center at which bridging or multiplexing functions are performed. The bridging functions performed are to connect three or more customer designated premises in a multipoint arrangement. The multiplexing functions are to channelize digital facilities to individual services requiring a lower capacity or bandwidth.

Different locations may be designated as hubs for different facility capabilities, e.g., multiplexing from digital to digital may occur at one location while multiplexing from digital to analog may occur at a different location. When placing an Access Order the customer will specify the desired hub. Serving wire centers, and hub locations, and the type of multiplexing functions available are identified in the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. Tariff F.C.C. No. 4. Some of the types of multiplexing available include the following:

- from higher to lower bit rate
- from digital to voice frequency channels

Point to point services may be provided on channels of these services to a hub. The transmission performance for the point to point service provided between customer designated premises will be that of the lower capacity or bit rate. For example, when a 1.544 Mbps channel is multiplexed to voice frequency channels, the transmission performance of the channelized service will be Voice Grade, not High Capacity.

The Telephone Company will commence billing the monthly rate for the service to the hub on the date specified by the customer on the Access Order. Individual channels utilizing these services may be installed coincident with the installation of the service to the hub or may be ordered and/or installed at a later date, at the option of the customer. The customer will be billed for a Voice Grade or a High Capacity Channel Termination, Channel Mileage (when applicable), and the multiplexer at the time the service is installed. Individual service rates (by service type) will apply for a Channel Termination and additional Channel Mileage (as required) for each channelized service. These will be billed to the customer as each individual service is installed.

Cascading multiplexing occurs when a High Capacity service is de-multiplexed to provide channels with a lesser capacity and one of the lesser capacity channels is further de-multiplexed. For example, a DS3 High Capacity service is de-multiplexed to 28 DS1 channels and then one of the DS1 channels is further de-multiplexed to 24 individual Voice Grade Channels.

When cascading multiplexing is performed, whether in the same or a different hub, a charge for the additional multiplexing unit also applies. When cascading multiplexing is performed at different hubbing locations, Channel Mileage charges also apply between the hubs.

The Telephone Company will designate hubs for Video Services. Full-time or part-time service may be provided between customer designated premises or between a customer designated premises and a hub and billed accordingly at the rates set forth in 7.5.3 or 7.5.4 following for a Channel Termination, Channel Mileage and Optional Features and Functions, as applicable.

At the request of a customer, the full-time and/or part-time services provided to the Hub may be connected together in the following configurations: full-time to full-time, full-time to part-time or part-time to part-time. The customer will be charged for each such connection made at the rates for Additional Labor as set forth in 13.2 following. The rates that apply for the service between each customer designated premises and the Hub are a Channel Termination and Channel Mileage, if applicable. In addition, for Program Audio services, rates for optional features and functions may be applicable.

Shared use occurs when special access service and switched access service are provided over the same high capacity DS1, DS3 or SONET based facilities through a common interface. The facility will be ordered, provided and rated as special access service (i.e., channel termination, channel mileage, multiplexing; ring connection and ring transport; or entrance ring connection). The nonrecurring charge that applies when the shared use facility is installed will be the nonrecurring charge associated with the appropriate special access high capacity DS1, DS3 or SONET based service. The customer must place an order for each individual switched access or special access service utilizing the shared use facilities and specify the channel assignment for each such service. Individual service (i.e., switched or special access) nonrecurring charges will not apply to the individual channels of the shared use facility. Rating as special access will continue until such time as the customer chooses to use a portion of the available capacity for providing switched access service.

For special access high capacity DS1, DS3 or SONET based facilities, excluding Gateway SONET Ring Service, the special access channel termination, channel mileage, applicable multiplexing, or ring connection and ring transport rates will be reduced by 1/24th for each DS1 channel, 1/672nd for each DS3 channel activated for switched access service. Switched access rates and charges as set forth in Section 6.8 preceding will apply for each channel of shared use facility that is used to provide switched access service (i.e., 1/24th of the switched access entrance facility, direct-trunked transport, and applicable multiplexing rates will apply for each channel of a DS1 service or 1/672nd for each channel of a DS3 service activated for switched access service).

For shared use on Gateway SONET Ring Service, the customer must designate a full DS1 or DS3 for the provision of switched access service. For OC12 service, the entrance ring connection rate will be reduced by 1/336 for each DS1 or 1/12 for each DS3 activated for switched access service. For OC48 service, the entrance ring connection rate will be reduced by 1/1,344 for each DS1 or 1/48 for each DS3 activated for switched access service. The DS1 or DS3 switched access entrance facility rates set forth in Section 6.8 preceding will apply for each DS1 or DS3 of the Gateway SONET Ring Service that is used to provide switched access service.

The applicable switched access entrance facility rate is dependent upon whether the special access high capacity DS1, DS3 or SONET based facility is provided with or without Telephone Company terminal equipment at the customer's premises (e.g., when a special access channel termination provisioned with Telephone Company provided terminal equipment at the customer's premises is activated for switched access service, the switched access rate for an entrance facility with Telephone Company provided terminal equipment will apply).

The Zone Density Plan will become effective concurrent with the first operational Expanded Interconnection arrangement, as described in Section 17.1 following, in the relevant Telephone Company study area.

The channel termination and channel mileage (fixed and per mile) rates applicable for high capacity services subject to the Zone Density Plan are dependent upon the zone in which the Telephone Company serving area is located. Channel mileage provided between wire centers in different zones will be assessed the rate for the higher zone. Specific Zone Density Charges are set forth in Sections 7.5.8 and 22.5.8 following. Term Discount Plans available for services provided under zone density pricing are set forth in Sections 7.5.10 and 22.5.10 following. Premier Term Discount Plans available for services provided under zone density pricing are set forth in Sections 7.5.14 and 22.5.14 following. The zones for each Telephone Company serving area are identified following:

The Special Access Term Discount Plan (TDP) applies to Special Access Digital Data Service (56.0 and 64.0 kbps), High Capacity DS1 (1.544 Mbps) and DS3 (44.736 Mbps) services, DS3 to DS1 and DS1 to DS0 Multiplexing, and Shared SONET Ring Service. The TDP provides the customer with discounted rates for the services listed. The customer agrees to a minimum service commitment per service on a state or national basis when the TDP is established.

In order for a circuit to be eligible for TDP pricing, the customer must commit a channel termination and/or multiplexer, or if not provided by the Telephone Company, the portion of the circuit (i.e., interoffice mileage) that is provided by the Telephone Company to a TDP. The commitment level for a circuit will be based on this information. For purpose of determining the term discount plan commitment level for Shared SONET Ring Service (SSRS), a Ring Connection equates to a Special Access Channel Termination. Customers may disconnect or move channel terminations and/or multiplexers within the committed area (i.e., state or nation) and not be subject to termination liability charges as long as the commitment levels are maintained.

(B) Commitment Level

All eligible special access rate elements for a given circuit (channel termination, channel mileage termination (fixed), channel mileage facility (per mile), multiplexing or ring connection and ring transport) must be ordered for the same commitment period with the same service date for the same customer. A customer establishes a TDP by committing all or a portion of their in-service circuits to a minimum term of 3 years up to maximum term of 5 years. During the term of the selected TDP, the customer must maintain an in-service commitment threshold of not less than 90% nor more than 130% of the committed circuits.

As long as a customer's actual in-service level of circuits remains within the commitment threshold, the customer will be billed the TDP rate for all eligible rate elements. Additionally, if a customer's in-service level exceeds the initial in-service level by no more than 30%, the customer will be billed the TDP rates for all eligible rate elements. For example, the customer has 200 DS1 circuits and elects to commit 150 circuits to a 3 year TDP. The customer will be billed TDP rates as long as the in-service level of circuits is equal to or greater than 135 (90% minimum threshold) but not more than 195 (130% maximum threshold).

If the customer's in-service request exceeds the initial service level by more than 30%, the customer will be billed the month-to-month rate for all facilities above the upper limit of the commitment threshold. If the customer's in-service level falls below the minimum commitment threshold, the customer will be billed termination liability charges for the number of circuits below the minimum commitment threshold, and the customer's commitment level will be decreased to 110 percent of the customer's current in-service level. For example, a customer whose minimum commitment threshold is 135 circuits (90% of 150), but only has 125 in-service, will be billed termination liability charges for 10 circuits, and the customer's commitment level will be decreased to 138 (110% of 125).

(C) Ordering Provisions

The customer must order a TDP in writing to the Telephone Company. A TDP may be ordered based on the following plan options.

3 Years  
5 Years

The customer must specify the plan and the length of the service commitment period and commitment level. The customer agrees to a minimum service commitment level per service per committed area (i.e., state or nation) in effect at one time. For example, a customer that has a state specific or nationwide 3 year plan in effect for DS1 service may not establish a second 3 year DS1 TDP for that area until the current TDP expires. Once the plan is established, and commitment levels are agreed upon, standard access ordering procedures will be followed.

When a customer converts to a TDP, no access order charges are applied toward facilities in-service at that time. If a customer moves from a month to month plan to a TDP, or upgrades from one TDP to another, no access order charges are applied.

When a circuit committed to a TDP is rearranged as set forth in 7.4.1(C)(3) preceding, the nonrecurring rearrangement charge associated with the month-to-month rates for that service will apply. Changes in the type of service or service termination are treated as disconnects and starts, and the nonrecurring installation charge associated with the month-to-month rates for that service will apply. Changes in the physical location of the point of termination are treated as moves, as described in 7.4.5 preceding, and will be assessed the nonrecurring charge associated with the month-to-month rates for that service.

(E) 90 Day Review Period

No adjustments in monthly billing for a TDP, for being above or below the commitment threshold described in (B) preceding, will take place until 90 days after Telephone Company written notification to the customer that the commitment threshold has been exceeded or has not been met. This will ensure that customers will not be penalized for aberrations in channel termination and/or multiplexer counts caused by timing differentials in disconnection and installation.

Customer's bills will not be adjusted for being outside the threshold described in 7.4.11(B) preceding during the 90 day review period. Additionally, customers will continue to be billed the adjustments (following the 90 day review period) for being outside the described threshold until the commitment level is met or re-established. Customers may increase their commitment level at any time by notifying the Telephone Company in writing. An increase in the commitment level will not change the expiration date of the TDP.

When a commitment level is increased, the actual in-service channel termination and/or multiplexer level at the time of the increase will be used to calculate the new commitment threshold as described in Section 7.4.11(B) preceding.

Upon written notification to the Telephone Company, customers may elect to have all future channel terminations and/or multiplexers installed during a commitment period automatically placed on the designated TDP.

Customers may request, upon written notification to the Telephone Company, that the Telephone Company automatically increase the customer's TDP commitment level when the 130% commitment threshold, as set forth in 7.4.11(B) preceding, is exceeded. The adjusted commitment level will be the actual channel terminations and/or multiplexers in service under the TDP at the time the 130% threshold is exceeded. The expiration date of the customer's TDP will not be affected by this change.

The customer may rescind its request to automatically add future channel terminations and/or multiplexers, or to automatically increase its commitment level when the 130% threshold is exceeded, by notifying the Telephone Company in writing.

Customers may only decrease their commitment level by paying termination liability charges on the number of channel terminations and/or multiplexers by which the commitment level is decreased. Termination liabilities will apply to applicable services covered by the TDP. For example, a customer has a commitment level of 150 channel terminations and/or multiplexers. The customer then decreases its commitment level to 125. The customer must pay a termination liability on the most recently disconnected 25 facilities, inclusive of all associated rate elements as listed above.

If a customer disconnects any portion of their TDP service prior to the expiration of the commitment period, the customer will be billed 50% of the monthly TDP charges for the remaining portion of the committed term. For example, a customer disconnecting in the 12th month of a 3 year plan will be charged 50% of the remaining 24 months of billing.

In this section, the term "rate" refers to the charges associated with the entire circuit covered by a TDP. If a Telephone Company initiated rate increase causes a customer's rates to increase by 10% or more at any one time, the customer may cancel the TDP without incurring termination liability charges.

(I) Extension of a TDP Commitment Period

A customer has two options for extending their TDP commitment period as described following:

- (1) A 3 year TDP commitment period can be extended by the customer at any time during the term of the plan, up to a maximum of 5 years. The number of months accrued in the current 3 year plan will apply toward the new 5 year plan selected. For example, a customer having completed 15 months of a 3 year commitment can extend the commitment to 5 years and no additional charges will be assessed. When a customer upgrades a DS1 or DS3 service being billed TDP rates to an Ethernet Transport (ET)<sup>(1)</sup> or Ethernet Virtual Private Line (EVPL) service offered by the Telephone Company, the customer's DS1 or DS3 TDP commitment level will be reduced at the customer's request as set forth following:

- for every 10 Mbps of ET or EVPL, the customer's DS1 commitment level will be reduced by 5 DS1s (e.g., 5 DS1s can upgrade to 10 Mbps ET or EVPL, 10 DS1s can upgrade to 20 Mbps ET or EVPL, etc.)

The rates and charges for SSRS are as set forth in Sections 7.5.10 and 7.5.11 following, and are in addition to any applicable rates and charges set forth in other sections of this tariff. There are two types of rates and charges that may apply to SSRS. These are monthly recurring rates and nonrecurring charges, both of which are billed in advance.

- (A) Monthly rates are flat recurring rates that apply each month or fraction thereof that a specific rate element is provided regardless of the amount of usage. For billing purposes, each month is considered to have 30 days.
- (B) Nonrecurring charges are one-time charges that apply for a specific work activity (i.e., installation). Nonrecurring charges may apply to each SSRS installed.
- (C) The minimum service period for SSRS is one month. Customers may migrate existing DS1 and DS3 special access services to the SSRS without incurring service rearrangement charges. Once existing DS1 and DS3 special access services are migrated to SSRS, customers will be billed for SSRS and will no longer be billed for DS1 and DS3 special access once the DS1 and DS3 special access services have been ordered to be disconnected.
- (D) The service performance maintenance guarantee, as set forth in Section 2.4.4(B)(7) preceding, also applies to SSRS.

The rates and charges for Gateway SONET Ring Service (GSRS) are set forth in Section 7.5.13 following, and are in addition to any applicable rates and charges set forth in other sections of this tariff. The applicable rates for GSRS are monthly recurring rates which are billed in advance.

- (A) Monthly rates are flat recurring rates that apply each month or fraction thereof that a specific rate element is provided regardless of the amount of usage. For billing purposes, each month is considered to have 30 days.
- (B) The service period for GSRS is three or five years. All GSRS commitments will begin in month one. If the customer requests that service be disconnected prior to the expiration of the three or five year service period selected, a 50% penalty will be assessed for the remaining months of the service period. For example, a customer disconnecting in the 12th month of a 3 year plan will be charged 50% of the remaining 24 months of billing.

Customers may upgrade existing GSRS Entrance Ring Connections (ERCs) from OC12 to OC48 prior to the expiration of the three or five year service period without penalty. An upgrade of the ERC requires that the customer start a new service commitment period beginning in month one. The new service commitment period must be equal to or greater than the service period in effect at the time of the upgrade.

Additionally, customers may discontinue GSRS, without penalty, should the monthly recurring rates increase by 10% or more at any one time. Rate decreases will automatically be applied to the monthly recurring rates for the remainder of the service period. If the customer does not specify renewal terms in writing 90 days prior to

\* Gateway SONET Ring Service (GSRS) is limited to existing customers as of June 1, 2002. The Premier Term Discount Plan (PTDP) applies to Special Access Voice Grade Service, monthly Program Audio Service, Digital Data Service, High Capacity Fractional DS1 Service, and High Capacity DS1 (1.544 Mbps) and DS3 (44.736 Mbps) Service. The PTDP provides the customer with discounted rates for the services listed. The customer agrees to commit 100% of their existing and future special access services ordered from the Telephone Company on a national basis for a five year commitment period when the PTDP is established.

The following rate elements will be eligible for PTDP rates:

Channel Termination  
Channel Mileage Termination (fixed)  
Channel Mileage Facility (per mile)  
Multiplexing

The commitment level will be based on special access circuit quantities determined by the Telephone Company's billing records and mutually agreed upon by the Telephone Company and the customer. The commitment level will be based on DS1 equivalent circuits, by state, and updated annually. If the customer's circuit quantity falls below 95% of the state specific commitment level in a consecutive 60 day period, a shortfall penalty as set forth in (C) following is applicable.

A customer's DS1 equivalent circuit quantities will be monitored monthly. A shortfall penalty will be applicable if the circuit quantities fall below 95% of the state specific commitment level for two consecutive months. When a shortfall exists for this period, the customer will be assessed a shortfall charge for each equivalent DS1 the customer is short of the commitment. The shortfall penalty will be applied monthly until the commitment level is achieved or the customer's PTDP is terminated as set forth in (E) following. The following states are excluded from the shortfall penalty:

- Kansas
- Nebraska
- Wyoming

The shortfall penalty will be calculated for each state by subtracting the actual DS1 circuit quantity from the DS1 equivalent commitment level. The shortfall penalty will be equal to the DS1 equivalent shortfall quantity multiplied by the shortfall charge, as set forth in 7.5.14(D) following.

For example, a customer has committed 1,000 DS1 equivalent circuits to a PTDP. The customer has fallen below 95% of their commitment for two consecutive months, and now has 940 DS1 equivalents. The shortfall of 60 DS1 equivalents, multiplied by the shortfall charge of \$327, equals the monthly shortfall penalty of \$19,620. The customer will continue to be billed PTDP rates for their remaining special access circuits on the PTDP.

The shortfall penalty will be assessed on the 60th day in which a shortfall exists, and will be applied to the customer's bill in the first available bill cycle following the shortfall period. The customer's account will be monitored monthly for continued shortfall status.

(D) Ordering Provisions

The customer must order a PTDP in writing to the Telephone Company. The completed PTDP order form should include the following information:

- PTDP effective date.
- All customer Access Carrier Name Abbreviations (ACNAs) participating in the plan.
- Initial DS1 equivalent commitment levels, by state.

Once the PTDP is established, standard access ordering procedures will be followed. When a customer converts existing special access services to a PTDP, no access order charges are applicable for facilities in-service at that time.

A termination liability penalty will be assessed if the customer cancels the PTDP prior to the expiration date of the PTDP five year commitment. If shortfall penalties are assessed for six consecutive months in the same state, the PTDP will be cancelled and termination liability penalties will apply.

A termination liability penalty will be calculated by multiplying the customer's DS1 equivalent commitment level times the remaining months in the PTDP, times the termination liability charge set forth in 7.5.14(E) following.

For example, a customer has 1,000 DS1 equivalent circuits committed to a PTDP and terminates service in month 48. The customer will be charged the remaining 12 months times the 1000 DS1 equivalent circuits committed, times the termination liability charge of \$164, for a termination liability penalty of \$1,968,000.

(F) Rate Changes

In this section, the term "rate" refers to the charges associated with the entire circuit covered by the PTDP. Rate increases or decreases will automatically be applied to the monthly term plan rates for the remaining term of the plan. If a Telephone Company initiated rate increase causes PTDP rates to increase by more than 10% at any one time, the customer may cancel the PTDP without incurring termination liability charges.

At the end of the PTDP service commitment period, the customer will have up to 12 months (365 days) to subscribe to a new PTDP at the prevailing rates set forth in Section 7.5.14 following. If the customer does not select a new PTDP, the rates will convert to the prevailing month-to-month special access rates set forth in Section 7.5 following, and will be effective as of the expiration date of the PTDP.

(H) Service Rearrangements

When a circuit committed to a PTDP is rearranged as set forth in 7.4.1(C)(3) preceding, the nonrecurring rearrangement charge associated with the month-to-month rates for that service will apply. Changes in the type of service or service termination are treated as disconnects and starts, and the nonrecurring installation charge associated with the month-to-month rates for that service will apply. Changes in the physical location of the point of termination are treated as moves, as described in 7.4.5 preceding, and will be assessed the nonrecurring charge associated with the month-to-month rates for that service.

(I) Cancellation Charges

When a customer cancels an order for special access service being provided under a PTDP, cancellation charges, as set forth in 5.2.4 preceding, will be calculated using the nonrecurring charges associated with the month-to-month rates for the service being cancelled.

The Revenue Volume Discount Plan (RVDP) provides revenue based discounts, which are applied to DS1, DS3 and Ethernet Virtual Private Line (EVPL) circuits, to be included in a revenue volume commitment level. The customer agrees to include 100% of their existing and future special access qualifying circuits to a three (3) year commitment period when the RVDP is established. The customer's RVDP revenue threshold is to be established on a state/regional basis as defined following:

At any time while on the RVDP, the customer may add or delete circuits as business dictates. These changes may increase or decrease the minimum monthly revenue threshold in which they fall. In these situations, the customer will receive the discount associated with the revenue threshold that is met for that month. For new special access DS1, DS3 and EVPL circuits added under the RVDP during the three (3) year commitment period, the Telephone Company will waive the nonrecurring installation charges associated with those services.

If the customer chooses to terminate their RVDP prior to the end of the three (3) year commitment period, the customer will be required to pay all nonrecurring charges originally waived upon installation of each circuit while on the RVDP, up to a maximum of \$500,000 per year the customer has been enrolled on the RVDP. The applicable nonrecurring charges for each service type can be found in other sections of this tariff.

Circuits to be included in the RVDP shall include only those circuits in service or ordered by the customers who are provided service by the Telephone Company for the Access Carrier Name Abbreviations (ACNAs) identified in the plan at the time the initial RVDP is established. Once the customer has completed 2 years of their initial 3 year RVDP, as a one time request only during year 3 of the RVDP, the customer may request that additional ACNAs be added to the RVDP. These ACNAs may include those circuits that the customer has gained through mergers, acquisitions or if the customer is acquired by a third party that may also be a customer of the Telephone Company. For customers who elect to move qualifying circuits from their TDP to an RVDP, any non-RVDP qualifying circuits shall remain on the TDP and the commitment levels shall be adjusted accordingly. To the extent the customer elects to move RVDP qualifying circuits from their PTDP to the RVDP, the remaining non-RVDP qualifying circuits must convert to month-to-month rates or another TDP, if applicable, provided in this tariff. If qualifying circuits under a TDP or PTDP are committed to an RVDP within ninety (90) days after the tariff filing becomes effective, no termination liability penalties will apply. (J) Renewal of a RVDP

The rates and charges for Ethernet Virtual Private Line (EVPL) service are set forth in Sections 7.5.18 and 22.5.18 following and are in addition to any applicable rates and charges set forth in any other sections of this tariff. Monthly recurring rates and nonrecurring charges applicable for EVPL service are billed in advance.

- (A) Monthly recurring charges are flat recurring rates that apply each month or fraction thereof that a specific rate element is provided regardless of the amount of usage. For billing purposes, each month is considered to have 30 days.
- (B) Nonrecurring charges are one-time charges that apply for a specific work activity (i.e., installation of service or change to an existing service) and are developed at full cost recovery on a labor hours per labor time basis. In addition, an EVPL Reconfiguration charge, as set forth in 7.5.18 and 22.5.18 following, will apply for each Ethernet Virtual Connection (EVC) or Quality of Service (QoS) established initially or when the customer requests the EVC or QoS be reconfigured after the initial set up. The EVPL Reconfiguration charge is in addition to all applicable charges associated with the new configuration. The EVPL Reconfiguration charge will not apply to customers who purchase EVPL under the 7 year Fixed Rate Term Plan (FRTTP).

Special construction charges, as set forth in Section 14 following, may apply when technical limitations and/or lack of facilities exist, or if it is necessary to construct facilities to satisfy service requests.

- (2) the customer commits to retain the replacement committed port connections in-service at the same bandwidth capacity for the remainder of the existing term commitment period; and
- (3) the customer's orders for the disconnect of the originally committed port connection and installation of the replacement committed port connection are submitted to the Telephone Company at the same time.

(3) Replacing a TDP

  - (1) the term commitment period of the new TDP meets or exceeds the number of months remaining in the customer's existing TDP commitment period; and

For example, a customer with an existing 3 year term commitment period and 50 Mbps of bandwidth of capacity for its committed TDP port connections can replace that term commitment in its entirety with a new 3 year or 5 year term commitment period at any time during the existing term commitment period without incurring termination liability charges provided the bandwidth capacity of the customer's committed TDP port connections under the new term commitment period is at least 50 Mbps.

(b) When the term commitment period of a replacement TDP does not meet or exceed the number of months remaining in the customer's existing TDP commitment period, termination liability charges, as set forth in (4) following, will apply.

(c) The customer may also replace an existing TDP with the Fixed Rate Term Plan (F RTP) described in (D) following without incurring termination liability charges provided the bandwidth capacity of the committed F RTP port connections meets the minimum bandwidth capacity requirement of the F RTP.

The termination liability charge will be equal to 50% of the total monthly recurring rates for each committed TDP port connection included in the customer's TDP for each month remaining in the term commitment period.

A customer discontinues its existing TDP in its entirety in the 20th month of a 3 year term commitment period. The customer included three 100 Mbps committed port connections when they established their initial term plan commitment.

An Ethernet Virtual Private Line Fixed Rate Term Plan (FRTTP) is available for EVPL service and applies to UNI and NNI port connections, EVPL channel mileage, EVC connections and QoS. A FRTTP provides the customer discounted rates for the rate elements listed below.

The customer orders the EVPL FRTTP under a term commitment period of 7 years. In order for a circuit to be eligible for FRTTP pricing, the customer must commit a UNI and/or NNI port connection to the FRTTP. All EVPL circuits ordered under the FRTTP will begin in month one.

The monthly rates for EVPL service under a FRTTP are set forth in 7.5.18 and 22.5.18 following.

Although the customer commits the UNI and NNI port connections to the FRTTP, the following rate elements will receive FRTTP rates:

UNI Port Connection  
NNI Port Connection  
EVPL Channel Mileage  
EVC Connection  
QoS

The EVPL Channel Mileage and QoS rate elements will not apply to secondary EVCs. The primary EVC and secondary EVC must terminate at the same location and the secondary EVC going to the customer designated premises shall be equal in bandwidth to that of the primary EVC. The customer will designate which EVC is to be utilized at any time as the primary EVC. Both EVCs cannot be used simultaneously as the primary EVC.

The customer may move the EVPL circuit and replace it with another EVPL circuit at a different location during the 7 year term commitment without early termination liability charges provided (1) the customer agrees to retain the new EVPL circuits at the new location for the remainder of the 7 year term period; (2) the relocated EVPL circuit is of equal or greater value to the one being removed; and (3) customer submits the orders for the disconnection of the existing EVPL circuit and the installation of the new EVPL circuit at the new location at the same time.

If the provisions set forth in the previous paragraph are not met, then termination liability charges, set forth in (2) following, will apply for the customer's failure to satisfy the term commitment period requirement for their committed port connections.

Nonrecurring charges will not apply to EVPL arrangements installed under a FRTP. Monthly rates for the entire 7 year term commitment period of the FRTP will not be increased by the Telephone Company for the 7 year term commitment period for each EVPL arrangement.

At the end of the 7 year term commitment period, the customer may subscribe to a new 7 year FRTP for EVPL service. If the customer does not notify the Telephone Company in writing within 60 calendar days prior to the expiration of the 7 year term commitment period of their intent to renew their FRTP, the EVPL rates will convert to the prevailing month-to-month rates set forth in Sections 7.5.18 and 22.5.18 following; or the customer may elect to commit to any other term plan that may be offered by the Telephone Company that is in effect at the time of expiration of their FRTP.

Customers who subscribe to a term discount plan (TDP) or premier term discount plan (PTDP) under 7.4.11 and 7.4.16 preceding or an EVPL TDP in (C) preceding may upgrade those services to an EVPL FRTP without incurring termination liability charges. The time in service under the TDP, PTDP or EVPL TDP will count toward the 7 year minimum term commitment period of the FRTP. For example, if a customer upgrades their PTDP after 24 months to the FRTP, they will have 60 months remaining in the FRTP. The customer must upgrade to a minimum circuit bandwidth capacity of 50 Mbps.

Customers may upgrade existing speed or capacity for EVPL port connections, QoS and EVC (i.e., 50 Mbps to 100 Mbps; 100 Mbps to 1 Gbps) without incurring termination liability charges and time in service under the existing EVPL service will count toward the 7 year term commitment period for the new EVPL arrangement.

(2) Termination Liability

Except where termination liability is waived as set forth in this section, if during the term of the FRTP the customer disconnects an EVPL arrangement prior to the expiration of the 7 year minimum commitment period, termination liability charges will apply as follows:

- (a) an amount equal to 100% of monthly recurring charges for each EVPL arrangement disconnected for the months remaining for year 1 of the 7 year term commitment period of the FRTP, if any, plus

## Example:

A customer discontinues an EVPL arrangement committed to the F RTP in month 20 of the 7 year minimum term commitment period. Using an illustrative monthly recurring rate of \$1800.00 for the EVPL arrangement, the Telephone Company would bill the customer termination liability charges totaling \$44,640.00.

For purposes of the FRTP, a Chronic Interruption is defined as (1) an interruption in service due to a failure on the core portion of the EVPL network on four (4) or more separate occasions of five (5) minutes or more each, or twenty-four (24) hours or more in the aggregate, in any calendar month; or (2) both EVCs do not meet network latency, jitter or packet delivery performance standards provided in 7.4.20(E)(2) following in any three (3) separate months during any period of six (6) consecutive months.

When a customer orders EVPL under a 7 year FRTP and a Chronic Interruption occurs with respect to EVPL, the Telephone Company will provide to the customer, within ten (10) calendar days of the last interruption or within a month after any failure to meet the network latency, jitter or packet delivery performance standards, a detailed report with respect to such interruptions on the EVPL service that will include the root causes of such interruptions, remedial actions being taken to prevent similar future interruptions and timelines for the completion of such actions. The Telephone Company will provide bi-weekly written updates on the progress of such remedial actions until completed to the reasonable satisfaction of the customer. The timeline for the completion of such remedial actions will not exceed thirty (30) days. If after the completion of such remedial actions an interruption or performance failure occurs on the same EVPL service, or the Telephone Company fails to complete such remedial action within such thirty (30) day period, the customer may terminate the affected EVPL service without incurring early termination liability charges, upon providing written notice of such termination to the Telephone Company within twelve (12) months of the date of the last interruption or failure to meet the network latency, jitter or packet delivery performance standards triggering a Chronic Interruption.

Service Level Agreements (SLAs) will be applied on a per Quality of Service (QoS) basis for Ethernet Virtual Connections (EVCs); traffic representing the different QoS (i.e., Gold, Silver or Best Effort) transported across the same EVC (measured between two NIDs) will have different SLAs. Details of the technical measurements and performance results methodologies for each commitment are provided in the Technical Publications set forth in 7.2.16(B) preceding.

In accordance with 7.4.20 (E)(4) following, credits are available for missed commitments to customers who purchase EVPL. Credits only apply for portions of the service provided by the Telephone Company.

- Repair Commitment

The Repair Commitment is measured on a per occurrence basis for each EVC for all QoS. A Fault Report is produced through the Telephone Company reporting system that aids identification of potential outage durations upon which credits may be provided.

The Telephone Company's calculation of its performance will be consistent with the Telephone Company's obligations to provide a credit for a missed performance commitment set forth following for SLA credits.

Time to Repair measures the duration of the interruption on the customer's EVPL for all QoS. This measurement will require the customer to report the problem to the Telephone Company. For EVPL, an interruption is defined as a condition that renders an EVPL circuit completely unavailable for use by the customer (i.e., the network is incapable of accepting and delivering customer data).

The repair interval will start with the time the trouble ticket is created and end when the fault is remediated. The SLA measurement will be based on each individual trouble ticket for a customer's connection. Time for scheduled maintenance windows as set forth in 7.2.16(A) preceding does not count towards SLA threshold.

The Telephone Company will not round up to the next nearest percent in order to meet the Network Availability service level commitment of 99.995%. Frame Relay Service (FRS) is a fast packet network that provides the customer high speed access and throughput to different customer addresses. Utilizing statistical multiplexing, the frame relay network enables the customer to allocate circuit bandwidth to applications as needed, rather than assigning fixed channels to specific applications.

Permanent Virtual Connections (PVCs) are logical channels that connect ports on a frame relay switch or between frame relay switches. PVCs are end-to-end, bi-directional channels that are established and disestablished via the service order process. A separate PVC must be established to each location that the customer desires to transmit data. These PVC channels are virtual because they are established in software tables and do not tie up facilities when not in use. Multiple PVCs can be defined over a single Frame Relay Access Link, thereby providing a single access line the capability to transmit data to multiple destinations.

Physical access to the Telephone Company's frame relay network is provided via a special access channel termination or an electrical cross-connect used in conjunction with expanded interconnection. Special access channel terminations must be ordered in accordance with the provisions set forth in Section 7, preceding. Electrical cross-connects must be ordered in accordance with the provisions set forth in Section 17, following. Customers who purchase FRS must also ensure that the special access facilities ordered from the Telephone Company are equipped with Bipolar with 8 Zero Substitution (B8ZS) line code, as well as Extended Super Frame (ESF) capability for DS1 facilities. The Telephone Company will provision FRS to support industry standards for the User to Network Interface (UNI) and the Network to Network Interface (NNI).

FRS is offered where facilities exist. If it is necessary to construct facilities to satisfy service requests, the service may be provided pursuant to the Telephone Company's Special Construction provisions set forth in Section 14 following.

Special access channel terminations or electrical cross-connects are used to connect the customer premises to the FRS UNI or NNI Port Connection. Special access channel terminations are provided under Section 7 preceding, and are available at speeds of 56.0/64.0 kbps through 1.544 Mbps for the UNI Port Connection and at 1.544 Mbps and 44.736 Mbps for the NNI Port Connection. Electrical cross-connects are provided under Section 17, following, and are available at 1.544 Mbps for the UNI Port Connection and 1.544 Mbps and 44.736 Mbps for the NNI Port Connection.

(B) User to Network Interface (UNI) Port Connection

The User to Network Interface (UNI) Port Connection is a standard interface used to connect the end user to the Telephone Company's frame relay network. It receives the data frame from the customer's network or CPE devices and verifies that the customer address destination is valid before relaying the frame. The UNI Port Connection is available at 56.0/64.0 kbps through 1.544 Mbps. The transmission speed of the UNI Port Connection may not exceed the transmission speed of the special access channel termination or electrical cross-connect. One special access channel termination or electrical cross-connect is required per UNI Port Connection.

(C) Network to Network Interface (NNI) Port Connection

The Network to Network Interface (NNI) Port Connection provides bi-directional polling between the Telephone Company's FRS switch and the interexchange carrier's or other customer's frame relay network.

The PVC provides a software-defined electronic path between two port connections within the frame relay network. A UNI or NNI Port Connection can be associated with any number of PVCs. Since all PVCs need not be in use at the same time, it is possible for the total bandwidth of all PVCs associated with one Port Connection to exceed the bandwidth of the Port Connection. It is not possible, however, for the simultaneous aggregate of the PVC's throughput to exceed the bandwidth of the Port Connection. Such a relationship is referred to as over-subscription or overbooking, and when this occurs, there can be no guarantee that the bandwidth defined for that PVC will be available at any point in time.

(E) Committed Information Rate (CIR)

CIR defines the amount of data throughput on a designated PVC that the Telephone Company will support under normal operating conditions. Any data burst beyond the CIR may be labeled Discard Eligible (DE) if the data transfer rate exceeds the CIR of the PVC being used. If the frame relay network develops congestion, the frames marked DE may be discarded.

The minimum service period for Frame Relay Service is one month.

When the customer orders additional PVCs with a designated CIR, the CIR nonrecurring charge shall apply. When a change is made to a customer's frame relay configuration at the customer's request, the administrative nonrecurring charge shall apply. Such changes are defined as those rearrangements necessary to add, delete, or rearrange the customer's configuration, including changes to CIRs. Although multiple changes may be caused by such actions, only one administrative charge will apply.

When the customer changes the CIR on an existing PVC, the CIR nonrecurring charge will apply in addition to the administrative nonrecurring charge.

8.3.4 FRS Term Discount Plans(A) General

Frame Relay Service Term Discount Plans (FRSTDPs) are available for UNI port connections at the speeds of 56.0/64.0 kbps through 1.544 Mbps. A FRSTDP provides the customer with discounted rates for the services listed. The customer agrees to a minimum service commitment per service on a state or national basis when the TDP is established.

A customer establishes a FRSTDP by selecting all or a portion of their in-service port connections and committing those port connections to a minimum term of 3 years up to a maximum term of 5 years. Customers may disconnect or move port connections within the committed area (i.e., state or nation) and not be subject to termination liability charges as long as the commitment levels are maintained.

When a UNI or NNI port connection committed to a FRSTDP is rearranged, a charge equal to one half the UNI or NNI port connection nonrecurring charge associated with the month-to-month rates for that service will apply. Service rearrangements are changes to existing (installed) services which do not result in either a change in the minimum period requirements as set forth in 5.2.6(E) preceding or a change in the physical location of the point of termination at the customer designated premises. Changes in the physical location of the point of termination are treated as disconnects and starts, and will be assessed the nonrecurring charge associated with the month-to-month rates for that service.

(D) Termination Liabilities

If a customer disconnects any portion of their FRSTDP service prior to the expiration of the commitment period, the customer will be billed 50% of the monthly FRSTDP charges for the remaining portion of the committed term. For example, a customer disconnecting in the 12th month of a 3 year plan will be charged 50% of the remaining 24 months of billing.

In this section, the term "rate" refers to the charges associated with the entire circuit covered by a FRSTDP. Rate increases or decreases will automatically be applied to the monthly term plan rates for the remaining term of the FRSTDP. If a Telephone Company initiated rate increase causes a customer's rates to increase by 10% or more at any one time, the customer may cancel the FRSTDP without incurring termination liability charges.

(F) Extension of a FRSTDP Commitment Period

FRSTDP commitment periods can be extended by the customer at any time during the term of the plan, up to a maximum of 5 years. The number of months accrued in the current plan will apply toward the new plan selected. For example, a customer having completed 15 months of a 3 year commitment can extend the commitment to 5 years and no additional charges will be assessed. The first payment will be considered the 16th payment under the new 5 year Plan.

(G) Renewal of a FRSTDP

At the end of the FRSTDP service commitment period, the customer may subscribe to a new FRSTDP at the prevailing rates set forth in Section 8.3.5 following. If the customer does not select a new FRSTDP, the rates will convert to the prevailing month-to-month UNI and NNI rates set forth in Section 8.3.5 following. The customer will have a 90 day grace period to renew their FRSTDP before month-to-month rates will be assessed.

(H) Cancellation Charges

When a customer cancels an order for frame relay services being provided under a TDP, cancellation charges, as set forth in 5.2.4 preceding, will be calculated using the nonrecurring charges associated with the month-to-month rates for the service being cancelled.

Wide Area Data Network (WADN) Service is a router-based data network service provisioned over Telephone Company provided facilities. WADN Service provides customers with local area network (LAN) to LAN, workstation to LAN, and LAN to workstation connectivity. WADN Service is provided on a dedicated basis at port speeds of 56.0 kbps, 128.0 kbps, and 1.544 Mbps.

WADN Service is offered where facilities exist. In situations where the Telephone Company must construct facilities to satisfy customer requests, WADN Service may be provided in accordance with the special construction provisions set forth in Section 14 following. If the customer is located in an area outside of the WADN, special access rates as set forth in Section 7 preceding will apply to dedicated facilities provided for customer connection to the WADN.

8.4.2 Rate Regulations

The minimum service period for WADN Service is three months.

When ordering WADN Service, the customer must specify all locations within the WADN which will be accessed for data transactions. The Dedicated Network Access Charge is applicable for each location connected to the WADN.

The administrative charge applies to each request received from a customer to add, change, delete, or otherwise modify the customer's routing patterns within the WADN.

The Telephone Company will provide Directory Assistance (DA) Service to a customer from Directory Assistance Service locations (DA location).

9.1 General Description

DA Service provides Directory Access Service to DA locations, use of DA access equipment, and use of DA operators to provide telephone numbers.

9.2 Undertaking of the Telephone Company

- (A) A Telephone Company DA operator, when furnished a name and locality, will provide or attempt to provide the telephone number listed in the Telephone Company DA records associated with the name given at the rates and charges as set forth in 9.6 following. The Telephone Company's contact with the customer's end user shall be limited to that effort necessary to process a customer's end user's request for a telephone number; and the Telephone Company will not transfer, forward or redial a customer's end user call to any other location for any purpose other than provision of DA Service.
- (B) A maximum of two (2) requests for telephone numbers will be accepted per call to the DA operator.
- (C) A telephone number which is not listed in the DA records will not be available to the customer's end user.
- (D) The Telephone Company will specify the DA location which provides the DA Service for each numbering plan area code (NPA). The DA locations are as shown in National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. Tariff F.C.C. No. 4.  
  
When it becomes necessary, as determined by the Telephone Company, to change a DA location, the Telephone Company will notify the involved customers six months prior to the change. For such changes, the regulations as set forth in 2.1.7 preceding apply.
- (E) When DA Service is ordered, Directory Access Service will be provided between the customer premises and the DA location by the Telephone Company at the rates and charges set forth in 9.6 following.

Each Directory Access Service will consist of the following:

- An Interface Group equipped with an available Premises Interface Code as set forth in 6.4.3 preceding.
- Directory Transport between the premises serving wire center and the DA location.

When required by the Telephone Company, a separate trunk group will be provided for DA Service for each NPA. Separate trunk groups will be required when the Telephone Company notifies the customer that the mechanized search of its data base and its mechanized operator practices require a mechanized identification of the NPA code for which the customer's end user desires DA information.

(2) Switched Transport Premises Interface Code

The Switched Access Service Switched Transport Premises Interface Codes are provided as set forth in 6.4.3 preceding. Further, when an access tandem is provided, the Directory Access Service will be provided, at the Telephone Company's choice, either as a separate trunk group or in association with Feature Group C or D Switched Access Service. Except as set forth in 9.4 (B) and (C) following, the Switched Transport Premises Interface Codes provided under a Special Order for Directory Access Service are subject to the order conditions as set forth in 5.1.1 preceding. For purposes of applying the order regulations, a DA location is considered to be a customer's end user's serving wire center.

(3) Directory Transport

Directory Transport provides the transmission facilities and transport termination between the premises of the ordering customer and the DA location. For purposes of determining Directory Transport mileage, distance will be measured from the wire center that normally serves the customer premises to the DA location(s).

Directory Transport is a two-way voice frequency transmission path composed of facilities determined by the Telephone Company. The two-way voice frequency path transports calls in the terminating direction (from the premises of the ordering customer to the DA location). The voice frequency transmission path may be comprised of any form or configuration of plant capable of and typically used in the telecommunications industry for the transmission of voice and associated telephone signals within the frequency band width of approximately 300 to 3000 Hz.

The Telephone Company will determine whether the Directory Access Service is to be routed directly to a DA location or through an appropriately equipped access tandem switch when such an access tandem switch is available. If the customer desires the traffic routing to be other than that selected by the Telephone Company, it may request a cooperative effort to determine if the customer specified traffic routing can be used in lieu of the Telephone Company selected traffic routing.

When Directory Transport is provided using a direct route to the DA location, no address signaling is provided. When Directory Transport is provided with the use of an access tandem switch, wink start-start pulsing signaling is provided at the access tandem switch. The customer will be notified by the Telephone Company when access tandem routing is provided and the customer shall address each call to the DA location using NPA + 555 + 1212. Only NPA codes handled by the DA location served by the access tandem switch will be processed.

(3) Directory Transport (Cont'd)

The number of Directory Transport transmission paths provided is based on the customer's order and is determined by the Telephone Company in a manner similar to Switched Access Service transmission paths as set forth in 6.5.5 preceding.

Except as set forth in 9.4 (A) following, Directory Transport provided under a Special Order is subject to all order conditions as set forth in Section 5 preceding.

Directory Transport is provided with a Switched Transport Interface Group as set forth in 6.4.3 preceding. Only Switched Transport Interface Groups 2-9 will be provided.

Directory Transport Services are comprised of the following rate elements, which are more fully described in 6.1.2 (A) and (B) preceding:

- Entrance Facility - for the transport of the DA call from the customer's premises to the serving wire center of that premises.
- Direct-Trunked Transport - for the transport of the DA call from the customer's serving wire center to the DA location without switching at a tandem or from the serving wire center to the tandem. This rate element includes both the termination (fixed) and facility (per mile).

- Tandem Switched Transport - for the transport of the DA call from the tandem to the DA location. This rate element includes Tandem Switched Transmission, Tandem Switching, Common and Dedicated Transport Multiplexing and Common and Dedicated Trunk Ports.
- Multiplexing - DS3 to DS1 multiplexing charges apply when a high capacity DS3 entrance facility or direct-trunked facility is connected with high capacity DS1 direct-trunked transport. The DS3 to DS1 multiplexer will convert a 44.736 Mbps channel to 28 DS1 channels using digital time division multiplexing. DS1 to voice grade multiplexing charges apply when a high capacity DS1 entrance facility or direct-trunked facility is connected with voice grade direct-trunked transport. The DS1 to voice grade multiplexer will convert a 1.544 Mbps channel to 24 voice grade channels.

Type B Transmission Specification is provided with Interface Groups 2 through 9 when routed direct to a DA location. Type A Transmission Specification is provided with Interface Groups 2 through 9 when routed via an access tandem. A, B and C Transmission Specifications Capabilities are set forth in 6.4.1 preceding.

The acceptance testing and testing capabilities for Directory Access Service traffic routed through an access tandem are the same as those for the associated Feature Group C or D end office switching. The acceptance testing for Directory Access Service traffic routed directly to or routed in a separate trunk group through an access tandem to the DA location will be as set forth in 6.1.5 preceding. The testing capabilities for Directory Access Service traffic routed directly to or routed in a separate trunk group through an access tandem to the DA location will be as set forth for cooperative scheduled testing or manual scheduled testing in Section 13 following.

- (F) Trunk-side switching is provided at the Directory Assistance Service access location. The Directory Assistance Service access location will provide trunk answer and disconnect supervisory signaling.

- (G) The Telephone Company will distribute the calls received over the Directory Access Services to the DA operators using the DA location access equipment.

When the DA location or DA operator equipment or terminals are out of service due to a Telephone Company equipment failure or an incorrect telephone number is provided by the DA operator, a credit as set forth in 9.4(F) following will apply.
- (I) DA Service may, at the option of the customer, be provided for interstate and intrastate communications. When the customer requests such mixed access, the interstate DA Service charges will be determined by the Telephone Company using the data furnished by the customer as set forth in 2.3.11 preceding.
- (J) The Telephone Company does not provide Directory Assistance Service for Interim 500 Access Service, Toll Free Code (TFC) Access Service or 900 Access Service.

9.3 Obligations of the Customer

- (A) The customer shall determine and order the Directory Access Services it needs for DA Service.
- (B) When Directory Assistance Service is initially ordered, the customer shall order the service for at least six months. Thereafter, additional service may be ordered for a minimum of six months. Not later than three months prior to the end of the six month period, the customer shall notify the Telephone Company if the service is to be discontinued at the end of the six month period. If no notice is received from the customer, the Telephone Company will automatically extend the service for another six months and all appropriate charges as set forth in 9.6 following for another six months will apply.

- (C) The customer facilities at the premises shall provide the necessary on-hook and off-hook supervision.

The minimum period for which DA Service and the Directory Access Service is provided and for which charges apply is six months. A minimum period of six months applies for each additional period of service ordered or extended.

If DA Service is discontinued prior to the end of each six month period, the charges that apply for the remaining months are the non-recoverable costs. Such costs include the non-recoverable cost of equipment and material ordered, provided or used, plus the non-recoverable cost of installation and removal including the costs of engineering, labor, supervision, transportation, rights-of-way and other associated costs less estimated net salvage.

A customer may cancel a Special Order for DA Service on any date prior to the service date. The cancellation date is the date the Telephone Company receives written or verbal notice from the customer that the Special Order is to be cancelled. The verbal notice must be followed by written confirmation within 10 days.

When a customer cancels a Special Order for DA Service after the order date but prior to the start of service, the appropriate charges as set forth in Section 5 preceding apply for the Directory Access Service ordered. In addition, a charge equal to any unrecoverable capital costs incurred by the Telephone Company will apply to the customer.

(C) Changes to Special Orders

When a customer requests changes to a pending order for DA Service, such changes will be undertaken if they can be accommodated by the Telephone Company. Charges as set forth in Section 5 preceding apply for the Directory Access Service changed. In addition a charge equal to any other costs incurred by the Telephone Company because of the change will apply.

(D) Moves

A move involves a change in the physical location of the point of termination at the customer premises or of the customer premises. Moves will be treated as set forth in 6.7.5 preceding and all associated nonrecurring charges will apply. Minimum period requirements will be established at the new location as set forth in 6.7.5 preceding. The customer will also remain responsible for satisfying all outstanding minimum period charges for the disconnected service.

(E) DA Service Rearrangements

Nonrecurring charges apply for service rearrangements. Service rearrangements are as set forth in 6.7.1(C)(3) preceding. The Service Rearrangement Charges are as set forth in 6.7.1(C)(3) for the type of change provided by the Telephone Company.

A per call credit equal to the sum of the DA Service usage sensitive rates set forth in 9.6 following (i.e., DA Service Call, and Tandem Switched Transport) will apply in the following situations:

- (1) When the DA location or DA operator equipment or terminals are out of service due to a Telephone Company equipment failure or an incorrect number is provided following customer connection to a Telephone Company DA operator.

10. Special Federal Government Access Services10.1 General

This section covers Special Access Services that are provided to a customer for use only by agencies or branches of the Federal Government and other users authorized by the Federal Government. Services provided to state or local emergency operations centers are included. These services provide for command and control communications, including communications for national security, emergency preparedness and presidential requirements. They are required to assure continuity of Government in emergency and crisis situations and to provide for national security.

Services for command and control communications and for national security and emergency preparedness sometimes require short notice and short duration service provisions. These provisions are especially needed to meet presidential requirements or in response to natural, man-made, or declared emergencies. Requirements of this type cannot be forecasted and are usually needed for a relatively short period. The provision of service under these conditions may require the availability of facilities, such as portable microwave equipment, which are provided on a temporary basis by the Telephone Company or customer.

10.2 Emergency Conditions

These services will be provided on the date requested or as soon as possible thereafter when the emergency falls into one of the following categories:

- State of crisis declared by the National Command Authorities (includes commitments made to the National Communications System in the "National Plan for Emergencies and Major Disasters").
- Efforts to protect endangered U.S. personnel or property both in the U.S. and abroad. (Includes space vehicle recovery and protection efforts.)
- Communications requirements resulting from hostile action, a major disaster or a major civil disturbance.

The Government Emergency Telecommunications Service (GETS) provides authorized federal government end users with a nationwide security and emergency preparedness switched voice and data communications service utilizing the public switched network, through the activation of a special code(s) in the Telephone Company's switching systems, as requested by the Federal Government or its authorized agent.

- (1) The GETS implementation charge, as set forth in 10.6.3(B)(1) following, is a one time nonrecurring charge which recovers certain costs incurred by the Telephone Company in preparing for the deployment of GETS.
- (2) High Probability of Completion (HPC) is a set of enhanced features, available for GETS in suitably equipped offices, which improves the probability of the completion of GETS traffic via the Public Switched Telephone Network (PSTN) during times of national emergencies or disaster, when the PSTN is congested due to heavy traffic or damage to the network. HPC provides the capability to set a special indicator, based on a specific 3, 6, or 10 digit dialed number string, specified by the government, that is carried through the network via SS7 signaling and will indicate that the call is a GETS call. Typically the digit string of 710 will be used to set the HPC indicator. This capability is not offered on toll free numbers such as 800 or 888 numbers.

Specialized Services or Arrangements may be provided by the Telephone Company, at the request of a customer, on an individual case basis if such service or arrangements meet the following criteria:

- (E) This offering is subject to the availability of the necessary Telephone Company personnel and capital resources.

12.2 Move Charges

- (A) When service without a maximum termination liability charge associated with it is moved to a different building, the nonrecurring charge applies; when moved to a new location in the same building, a charge of one-half the nonrecurring charge applies.

13.1 Additional Labor

Additional labor is that labor requested by the customer on a given service and agreed to by the Telephone Company as set forth in 13.1.2 through 13.1.7 following. The Telephone Company will notify the customer that additional labor charges as set forth in 13.1.8 following will apply before any additional labor is undertaken.

13.1.1 Engineering

Additional Engineering will be provided by the Telephone Company at the request of the customer only when:

- (A) A customer requests additional technical information after the Telephone Company has already provided the technical information normally included on the Design Layout Report (DLR) as set forth in 6.1.4 and 7.1.6 preceding.
- (B) Additional engineering time is incurred by the Telephone Company to engineer a customer's request for a customized service as set forth in 7.2 preceding.
- (C) A customer requests a design change, and additional engineering time is incurred by the Telephone Company for the engineering review as set forth in 5.2.3(C). The charge for additional engineering will apply whether or not the customer authorizes the Telephone Company to proceed with the design change.

- (A) Presubscription is a procedure whereby an end user# may select and designate to the Telephone Company an IC to access, without dialing an access code, for interLATA interstate calls. This IC is referred to as the end user's primary IC. The presubscription procedure also allows the agent\* representing a pay telephone to select and designate to the Telephone Company an IC to access, without dialing an access code, for interstate interLATA calls. Presubscription is available only to End Users served by end offices that have been converted to provide Feature Group D Switched Access Service.
- (B) Presubscription of residence and business lines and/or trunks is furnished in accordance with the detailed provisions of the Federal Communications Commission's Allocation Plan. The plan with all appendices is available for inspection at the main building of the Federal Communications Commission in the Public Reference Room of the Tariff Division. Copies may be obtained from the Federal Communications Commission's Commercial Contractor.

The same detailed provisions also apply to pay telephone presubscription for end offices converting to equal access after February 10, 1990. Pay telephone presubscription for end offices converted to equal access prior to February 10, 1990, will follow a transition schedule. After that date, pay telephone lines will be included in the standard presubscription time line for the end office.

# For purposes of this section, the term end user also includes alternative local exchange carriers (ALECs) that are certified to resell local exchange telecommunications services.

\* An agent is the person or persons who have the legal authority to give permission for the placement of pay telephones on their premises and who control access to or usage of the pay telephone.

(2) End users may designate that they do not want a primary IC. This choice is considered a valid selection and a Presubscription Charge will apply to any subsequent change. This "no primary IC" designation is not available to pay telephone agents.

- (1) The TSP System was developed to satisfy the requirements of the National Communications System (NCS) of the Federal Government and provides the regulatory, administrative and operational procedures authorizing the priority installation and/or priority restoration of National Security Emergency Preparedness (NSEP) telecommunications services. TSP applies only to NSEP telecommunications services, and authorizes the Telephone Company to take priority action in the provision and restoration of such services.
- (2) Priority installation and/or priority restoration of NSEP telecommunications services shall be provided in accordance with Part 64.401, Appendix A, of the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) Rules and Regulations, and in accordance with the guidelines set forth in the *Telecommunications Service Priority (TSP) System for National Security Emergency Preparedness (NSEP) Service Vendor Handbook (NCSH 3-1-2) and Service User Manual (NCSM 3-1-1)*.
- (3) The customer requesting TSP service must be the same customer for which the associated access service is provided.
- (4) Certain conditions may require that one or more customer services with a lower or no restoration priority be preempted in order to install or restore NSEP telecommunications service(s) of a higher priority. When such preemption is necessary, the Telephone Company will make every reasonable effort to notify the preempted customer of the action to be taken. - (5) In obtaining TSP, the customer authorizes the Telephone Company to provide certain customer record information to the Manager, NCS, of the Federal Government so that the Government can maintain and administer its TSP System. This customer record information will include only the customer's name, TSP authorization code, Telephone Company circuit ID, customer telephone number and customer mailing address.
- (6) In order to provide priority restoration service in compliance with Part 64.401, Appendix A, of the FCC's Rules and Regulations, the Telephone Company may be unable to notify the customer in advance where additional labor charges apply, as set forth in 13.1, before the required additional labor is undertaken. Central office blocking and screening services are provided on an as available basis depending upon the capabilities of various switching equipment. In addition, these services are generally available only in equal access exchanges. Accordingly these services may not be available in all exchanges.

- (A) Originating Line Screening (OLS) provides call screening information to the operator to prevent operator sent-paid (1+) calls from being billed to the line. This service is implemented by sending two information digits (generally known as II digits) with the Automatic Number Identification (ANI) of the originating line. These digits are transmitted to all carriers with the ANI. Additional information in the form of identification of the type of line, i.e. hotel, pay telephone, etc. may be provided to carriers for use in databases. This feature informs the OSP of any restrictions associated with the line for outgoing calls to which a caller is attempting to bill a call. This option can be used with the Bill Number Screening and International DDD Blocking options.
- (B) Billed Number Screening (BNS) provides automatic blocking of third number billing, collect billing, or both. BNS is implemented via external databases that may be queried by carriers as appropriate. The BNS feature is established for a particular billing number via service order. This feature informs the OSP of any restrictions regarding collect or third number calls billed to the line. This option can be used with the Originating Line Screening and International DDD Blocking options.

- (C) International DDD Blocking provides a central office blocking service that blocks all calls dialed 011+ and 101XXXX011+. This service is available only to business customers and to certain line classes such as are used by hotels, hospitals, pay telephones, etc.

International blocking and screening services may also be available under the Telephone Company's general or local exchange tariffs. The services are available to all customers where technically feasible.

The following nonrecurring charges will be applied on a per line or per trunk basis. These rates are not intended to be duplicative with blocking and screening services provided under the Telephone Company's general or local exchange tariffs. For example, a customer may request International DDD Blocking from either the general/local exchange tariff or from CenturyLink Operating Companies, Tariff F.C.C. No. 9.

900 Access Blocking is an optional end user feature that provides end office blocking, where technically feasible, of direct-dialed 1+900+ and 101XXXX+900+ calls by routing such calls to a recorded announcement. 900 Access Blocking is available for use with Feature Group A switched access services described in Section 6. preceding and with services offered under the Telephone Company's local or general exchange tariffs which are provided to end users and to end user customers for the provision of telephones to transient members of the public or to transient users of an aggregator's premises.

(B) Regulations

End user requests for 900 Access Blocking will be accepted by the Telephone Company in a manner consistent with the regulations set forth in the Telephone company's local or general exchange tariffs. Requests by subscribers to remove 900 Access Blocking services must be submitted to the Telephone Company in writing.

(C) Rates and Charges

Carrier Call Transfer Service allows a participating IC to receive an on-line transfer call from a Telephone Company Business office via an interexchange carrier's (IC's) toll-free number. The IC must provide a toll free number dedicated solely for the Carrier Call Transfer Service. In addition, the IC must assign the highest call priority to all calls transferred by the Telephone Company under Carrier Call Transfer. This will allow Telephone Company calls to be routed to the first available IC representative regardless of other calls waiting in queue.

(B) General

Carrier Call Transfer permits an end user customer to be transferred to the IC if the end user customer has a question pertaining to service establishment/relocation, product inquiries, literature requests or if the end user customer has a billing inquiry regarding the IC's charges. Transfers to ICs for billing inquiry will not be offered when the Telephone Company provides billing inquiry for the IC. Additional transfer activity will be available from the end user customer to the IC based upon mutual agreement between the Telephone Company and the IC.

Following are descriptions of the optional features that are available in conjunction with pay telephone service. These features are available only in technically equipped central offices.

- (A) Answer Supervision provides the capability of delivering an off-hook supervisory signal from the central office serving the customer to a line interface at the customer's premises for local and 1+ intraLATA toll calls processed and completed by the Telephone Company. The transmitted supervisory signal indicates that the called party has answered the incoming call.
- (B) Coin Control uses a software driven system to provide features and capabilities similar to those provided by the microprocessor based "smart" pay telephone sets. Coin control provides the following central office features for use with coinless or coin operated pay telephone service:
  - (1) Coin collection, return and recognition - monitors signals from the pay telephone to identify when coins are deposited. This feature identifies the status of the attempted call, and sends a signal to the pay telephone to collect the coins when the call is completed or return the coins when the call is not completed.
