The accompanying tariff material issued by BellSouth Telecommunications, LLC (BellSouth) and bearing Tariff F.C.C. No. 1 and Tariff F.C.C. No. 3, is sent to you for filing under authority of Special Permission No. 11-006 from the F.C.C. and in compliance with the requirements of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended.

This filing, scheduled to become effective July 1, 2011, consists of the tariff pages as indicated on the following check sheets:

On June 16, 2011, BellSouth filed Transmittal No. 2 (2011 Annual Filing), which is scheduled to become effective on July 1, 2011. After filing Transmittal No. 2, BellSouth discovered that a few isolated current rates listed in the cost support exhibits applicable to Local Switching and Dedicated Tandem Trunk Port DS1 were incorrectly listed on the tariff pages. Also, BellSouth determined that the Primary Residential Line EUCL, which for the past several years was capped at \$6.50 pursuant to rule 69.152, has now fallen below that cap and that this rate was not correctly reflected.

Additionally, on June 16, 2011, BellSouth filed Transmittal No. 1 to reissue tariffs under its new name, which are scheduled to become effective on July 1, 2011. BellSouth proposes to add three isolated pages which were found to be either incorrect or missing from this filing. In BellSouth Telecommunications FCC No. 1, BellSouth proposes to include rates which were found to be missing for Local Switching Usage Sensitive Rates. Also proposed is the addition of two missing pages for BellSouth Telecommunications FCC No. 3.

BellSouth is also amending the TRP to correct inadvertent errors.

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Supporting information discussed under Section 61.49 of the Commission's Rules, to the extent applicable, is included with this filing in the attached Description and Justification.

In accordance with Section 61.14, this transmittal letter and associated attachments are being filed electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS) in compliance with the electronic filing procedures.

Payment in the amount of \$845.00 has been electronically transmitted to the US Bank in St. Louis, Missouri, in accordance with the fee program procedures. The Form 159 is being transmitted electronically via ETFS as a proprietary document. These actions have been committed on the date established as the issued (filed) date as reflected above.
