Dear Ms. Dortch:

The accompanying tariff material, issued on behalf of our client RC Communications, Inc. (the "Company"), bearing FCC No. 1, Access Service, is being sent to you for filing in compliance with the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, to become effective December 29, 2011.

The filing modifies Section 6 (Switched Access Service) to introduce new provisions in compliance with the Commission's Intercarrier Compensation rule changes that become effective December 29, 2011.

The proposed revisions to Section 6.1 specify that in the absence of a negotiated interconnection agreement between an interconnecting carrier and the Company addressing the treatment of Toll Voice over Internet Protocol – Public Switched Telephone Network (VoIP-PSTN) traffic, the rates and charges for Switched Access Service specified in Section 12.2 of the tariff will apply on all jurisdictionally interstate Toll VoIP –PSTN traffic.

This filing also revises Section 6.6 (Obligations of the Customer) to specify the call signaling information the customer is required to transmit on traffic handed off to the Company for termination to the Company's end user subscribers.

Also, this filing makes a number of changes to existing definitions in Section 2.6 (Definitions) as well as to introduce a number of new definitions related to the proposed changes to the regulations in Section 6.
