Cincinnati Bell Telephone (CBT) hereby applies for Special Permission pursuant to Section 61.51 of the Commission's Rules for waiver of Sections 61.58 (Notice Requirements) and 61.59 (Effective Period Required Before Changes Can Be Made To a Proposed Or Effective Tariff Revision) in order to file on not less than 1 day's notice to withdraw the tariff material which was filed with Transmittal No. 866 prior to its effective date and to restore the tariff pages currently in effect.

CBT also hereby applies for Special Permission pursuant to Section 61.51 of the Commission's Rules for waiver of Section 61.58 (Notice Requirements) in order to file, on not less than one day's notice, the tariff pages formerly filed in Transmittal No. 866 to be effective April 1, 2012.

On March 26, 2012, CBT filed Transmittal No. 866 become effective on April 2, 2012. Transmittal No. 866 was filed to implement CBT's Second Quarter, 2012 Universal Service Fund (USF) factor.

CBT respectfully requests permission to waive Sections 61.58 and 61.59 of the Commission's Rules to allow CBT to withdraw, without becoming effective, the tariff revisions proposed in Transmittal No. 866 and to restore the tariff pages currently in effect. CBT wishes to withdraw the proposed revisions in order to allow CBT to file, on not less than one day's notice, the Second Quarter 2012 USF factor effective on April 1, 2012. Attached are the illustrative tariff pages.

In accordance with the Commission's filing fee requirements, a filing fee of \$845.00 has been paid by credit card and an electronic Form 159 has been submitted.
