With this filing Verizon is making the following revisions:

- Eliminating the requirement that customers provide three months' notice when they discontinue Switched and Special Access DS3 Term Pricing Plans in FCC1 and Special Access DS3 High Capacity Services in FCC14 and FCC16. This revision will provide customers more freedom and aligns with existing notification requirements for Verizon's DS1 services and other tariffed DS3 services.
- Correcting Wire Center Zone Assignment list in FCC1, Section 14. Hagerstown, Maryland (HGTWMDHG) was incorrectly included on Page 14-21. The correct listing for Hagerstown, Maryland appears on Page 14-19
- Adding terms to FCC1, FCC11, FCC14 and FCC16 pertaining to identifying and rating toll VoIP-PSTN traffic consistent with the USF/ICC Transformation Order (FCC 11-161) issued on November 18, 2011, which became effective on December 29, 2011. These terms are added for clarification only out of an abundance of caution.
- Removing the Corridor Service Single Company Ordering and Billing Option from FCC11. Since Verizon consolidated its billing systems for Tariff FCC No. 1 and 11, single ordering and billing is automatically provided; therefore, this option is no longer required.
- Removing duplicate language from Pages 25-8.14 and 25-8.14.1 in FCC11. This language correctly appears on Page 25-14.
- Removing an obsolete reference in FCC14 that should have been removed under Transmittal No. 1155 effective on July 1, 1998, which implemented LTR Phase 2.
- Removing certain rates from FCC14 that had been required prior to Verizon converting all of its end offices to equal access end offices. These rates should have been removed under Transmittal No. 1156 effective on August 25, 2011.
- Correcting typographical errors and USOCs in FCC14.

- Removing duplicate wording from FCC14, Page 5-11.1.
- Removing USOCs and corresponding footnote applicable only to PA and VA from those rate pages in FCC14 that do not display PA or VA rates.
- Adding a footnote inadvertently omitted from FCC14, Page 20-178.
- Removing obsolete references from FCC16 that should have been removed under Transmittal No. 322 effective on July 1, 2000, which deleted residential PICC rates.
- Removing an obsolete reference from FCC16 that should have been removed under Transmittal No. 247 effective on July 1, 1998, which implemented LTR Phase 2.

Supporting material as specified under Section 61.49 of the Commission's rules is not required for this filing. There was no Price Cap base period demand for the Corridor Service Single Company Ordering and Billing Option in the Price Cap Indices filed in the 2012 Annual Filing. Therefore, there is no impact on any of the Price Cap indices. Hence supporting material as specified under Section 61.49 of the Commission's rules is not required for this filing. These elements will be removed from the Price Cap detail with the next filing requiring Price Cap support.

This transmittal letter and associated attachments are being filed electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS).
