APPLICATION OF TARIFF

- 1.1 This tariff contains regulations, rates and charges applicable to Carrier Common Line, Switched Access, Special Access, End User Access, Lifeline Assistance, Universal Service Fund, Expanded Interconnection Service, Advanced Communications Networks, Ethernet Private Line Access Service or, in combination, as Facilities for Interstate Access, hereinafter referred to as FIA, provided by the issuing carriers of this tariff, hereinafter referred to as the Telephone Company to customers. This tariff further provides for Ancillary and Miscellaneous Services. This tariff does not apply to other services offered by the Telephone Company.
- 1.2 Regulations, rates and charges as specified in this tariff apply to FIA and shall not serve as a substitute for IC tariff offerings of services to end users. The provision of such FIA by the Telephone Company as set forth in this tariff does not constitute a joint undertaking with an IC for the furnishing of any service.
- 1.3 References in this tariff to a Special Construction Tariff refers to the following tariff as effective in its respective territories:

As another example, assume Frontier North Inc. transfers a portion of its assets to an unaffiliated third party. Further assume that a customer who subscribes to a DS1 ETTVP with an eight (8) year commitment period and a committed quantity of 18,000 DS1 SALs (threshold level of 10,001 – 20,000 DS1 SALs) is three thousand (3,000) DS1 SALs short of its committed quantity at the next scheduled annual review following the Transfer, and that such shortage would normally result in the application of a shortfall penalty. Finally assume that three thousand (3,000) DS1 SALs were transferred to an unaffiliated third party in the Transfer and that the in-service quantity of DS1 SALs as measured at the next annual review is fifteen thousand (15,000). In this case, the Telephone Company will apply a Transfer Adjustment which adds the 3,000 DS1 SALs lost in the Transfer (the Transfer Adjustment Units) to the 15,000 DS1 SALs which are in-service (the Actual Units), the result of which is 18,000 DS1 SALs (the Adjusted Units) and rates continue to be applied at the 10,001 to 20,000 threshold level with no shortfall penalty being assessed to the customer.

- (D) For Service Level Agreements (SLAs), a customer who participates in one of such SLAs prior to a Transfer shall continue with such SLA for the balance of the subscription term, regardless of whether or not the customer is able to satisfy the requirement(s) of the SLA using the reduced quantity of services the Telephone Company provides to the customer following a Transfer. The following SLAs are subject to this Section 2.9.2(D):

- 2010 Enhanced Service Level Agreement as set forth in Section 2.8.2.4 preceding
- 2010 National Service Level Agreement as set forth in Section 2.8.3.2 preceding

For example, assume Frontier North Inc. transfers a portion of its assets to an unaffiliated third party. Further assume that a customer subscribes to the 2010 Enhanced SLA Plan for Qualifying Services under Section 2.8.2.4 preceding. The 2010 Enhanced SLA Plan for Qualifying Services requires that the customer have at least thirty-five (35) measured transactions per month as a condition for participation in such SLA. Finally, assume that immediately following the Transfer, the customer has only twenty-two (22) measured transactions. In this case, the customer will be allowed to continue its subscription to the 2010 Enhanced Service Level Agreement for the remainder of the subscription term ending December 31, 2010. (C)

21. CONTRACT TARIFFS

This section contains terms and conditions and rates and charges for contract tariffs provided by the Telephone Company. Individual contract tariffs are filed in 21.2 following.

21.1 General

Contract tariffs apply in Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA) which are eligible for Phase I and Phase II Pricing Flexibility. MSA that are eligible for Phase II Pricing Flexibility are further subject to Level 1 and Level 2 MSA pricing. Telephone Company Phase II MSAs and Level 1 and 2 pricing eligibility within the operating territories of The Frontier Telephone Companies are set forth in this Tariff F.C.C. No. 5, Section 19.1 and Tariff F.C.C. No. 4, Section 14.7.

Each contract tariff includes a serving area that is comprised of one or more MSAs within the operating territories of one or more Frontier Operating Telephone Companies. This tariff provides for service within the operating companies of Frontier Communications of the Southwest Inc., Frontier North Inc., Frontier Communications Northwest Inc., Frontier Communications of the Carolinas Inc., and Citizens Telecommunications Company of California, Inc. whose operating territories are specified in Section 19.1 preceding. The remaining Frontier Operating Telephone Companies participate in Tariff F.C.C. No. 4, and/or No. 8 as shown below. These tariffs also specify the operating territories of each company. (C) (C)
