RE: Amended Transmittal No. 163 -- 2013 Mid Course Annual Access Charge  
Tariff Filing

The accompanying tariff material, issued by the Illinois Consolidated Telephone Company and bearing Tariff F.C.C. No. 2 Access Service, is sent to you for filing in compliance with the requirements of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. The proposed effective date of October 1, 2013, is fifteen days after the filing date, in accordance with Section 204(a)(3) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, and Order DA 13-553, In the Matter of July 2, 2013 Annual Access Charge Tariff Filings.

In its mid-course filing, Consolidated re-stated its exogenous costs to reflect the correct annual changes as well as the reconciliation for 3 months of over-recovery of said charges. Consolidated essentially used its pre-July rates as the embedded base and reflected the lower exogenous changes, thus lowering its PCI but still showing a PCI greater than 1. After discussions with personnel from AT&T, they request that we restate the TRP so that the post July rates are used as the embedded base and that only the negative exogenous cost adjustments reflecting the adjustment for 3 months of over-recovery are included so that the PCI falls below 1, thus the TRPs and some D&J exhibits are amended to reflect these changes. These changes have no impact on proposed rates or any of the CAF/ICC worksheets.
