SECTION 2 – REGULATIONS, (CONT'D.)**2.9 Notices and Communications**

- 2.9.1 The Customer shall designate on the Service order an address to which the Company shall mail or deliver all notices and other communications, except that Customer may also designate a separate address to which the Company's bills for service shall be mailed.
- 2.9.2 The Company shall designate on the Service Order an address to which the Customer shall mail or deliver all notices and other communications, except that Company may designate a separate address on each bill for service to which the Customer shall mail payment on that bill.
- 2.9.3 All notices or other communications required to be given pursuant to this tariff will be in writing. Notices and other communications of either party, and all bills mailed by the Company, shall be presumed to have been delivered to the other party on the third business day following placement of the notice, communication or bill with the U.S. Mail or a private delivery service, prepaid and properly addressed, or when actually received or refused by the addressee, whichever occurs first.
- 2.9.4 The Company or the Customer shall advise the other party of any changes to the addresses designated for notices, other communications or billing, by following the procedures for giving notice set forth herein.
- 2.10 Federal Regulatory Fee: The Federal Regulatory Fee is an aggregated monthly charge assessed by the Company to recover amounts remitted by XO to comply with federally-imposed regulatory requirements. These amounts include funds remitted by XO to support Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS) for the hearing-and speech-impaired, administration of the North American Numbering Plan (NANPA), and shared industry costs of local number portability administration (LNPA), as well as Interstate Telecommunications Service Provider fees remitted by XO annually to the Federal Communications Commission. Customers subject to this Fee will be assessed 3 percent of their net interstate and international telecommunications (including Voice-over-Internet-Protocol (VOIP) service) charges, exclusive of taxes.
- 2.11 Federal Cost Recovery Fee: The Federal Cost Recovery Fee is an aggregated monthly charge assessed by the Company to recover costs incurred by XO to comply with federally-imposed requirements including, but not limited to, compliance and reporting obligations associated with network outages, revenue reporting, customer proprietary network information (CPNI) requirements, law enforcement intercept obligations (not covered via other mechanisms), and other federal programs. This Fee is 0.7 percent of a Customer's net interstate and international telecommunications (including Voice-over-Internet Protocol (VOIP) service) charges, exclusive of taxes.
- 2.12 Property Tax Allotment Fee: The Property Tax Allotment Fee is an aggregated monthly charge assessed by the Company to recover the taxes imposed on property used by XO to provide interstate and international services paid by XO directly, or indirectly through third parties, to the state and local government authorities imposing such taxes. This Fee is 1 percent of a Customer's net interstate and international telecommunications (including Voice-over-Internet-Protocol (VOIP) service) charges, exclusive of taxes.

Service Provider Number Portability (SPNP) also known as Number Portability allows, where facilities permit: (1) a local exchange telephone service customer to maintain the same Telephone Number (TN) when changing from one telecommunications service provider to another while remaining within the same rate center; and (2) callers to complete calls to numbers that have been ported. SPNP will be used throughout this tariff to describe the Number Portability Charge.

B. SPNP Surcharge

The SPNP Surcharge recovers Company specific costs directly related to providing long term number portability. It is billed on a monthly basis to all local switched Time Division Multiplexing (TDM) and payphone services customers, except customers who participate in the Lifeline Assistance Program, as described below.

Local Number Portability (LNP) allows, where facilities permit: (1) a local exchange telephone service customer to maintain the same Directory Number (DN) when changing from one telecommunications service provider to another while remaining at the same location; and (2) callers to complete calls to numbers that have been ported.

The LNP Surcharge recovers Company-specific costs directly related to providing long term number portability. The monthly charge is assessed on a monthly basis to all local switched Time Division Multiplexing (TDM) and payphone services customers, except those who participate in the Lifeline Assistance Program. The LNP End User Surcharge is assessed on a per line basis except as set forth following:
