Enclosed please find, for filing, Great Lakes Communication Corp.'s ("Great Lakes") revisions to its FCC Tariff No. 2, which reduce Great Lakes' terminating Local Switching and End Office Shared Port Switched Access rates to mirror those contained in CenturyLink Operating Companies' F.C.C. Tariff No. 11. Additionally, the changes also split the Switched Access Service rate elements into separate originating and terminating components. No changes have been made to the rates for the originating Local Switching and End Office Shared Port rate elements, nor to the originating or terminating transport elements. This filing is made pursuant to §204(a)(3) of the Act, and is filed on fifteen (15) days' notice, with an issue date of July 3, 2014 and an effective date of July 18, 2014.

Great Lakes is a non-dominant carrier and, therefore, supporting documentation under Part 61.38 of the Commission's Rules is not required.

In accordance with Part 61.20(b)(1) of the Commission's Rules, this original Transmittal Letter, without attachments, FCC Form 159 and a check in the amount of \$910.00 have been sent via overnight delivery to U.S. Bank in St. Louis, MO as of this date.
