7.1.1 End User Charges and Fees (T)

A. Line Access/Subscriber Line Charge (C)(D)

The Company recovers some of its costs to provide the local network that supports the Customer’s ability to make and receive calls through a flat rated, monthly recurring charge. The charge is assessed based on the number of lines and/or trunks subscribed to by a Customer and may appear on the Customer’s bill as a Line Access or a Subscriber Line Charge.

¹ The PRI charge is for a full or fractional PRI and is capped at 4 PRI facilities per location. Customers that entered into agreements after 12/21/16 and before 5/1/2019 will not be assessed this charge until contract renewal. SIP Trunks contracted prior to 12/21/16 may be assessed a monthly charge of \$3.25 for each increment of 4 call paths of service.

B. Federal Universal Service Fee (FUSF)

Telecommunications companies must pay a percentage of their interstate end-user revenues to the Universal Service Fund. This percentage is called the contribution factor. The contribution factor changes four times a year (quarterly) and is increased or decreased depending on the needs of the Universal Service programs.

The FUSF fee, which is authorized by the Federal Communications Commission, provides funding for programs to keep local telephone rates affordable for all customers and to provide discounts to schools, libraries, rural health care providers and low-income families.

The Federal Universal Service Fund fee - Primary rate shall be reduced by 100% for Lifeline residential subscribers meeting Lifeline eligibility criteria as established by their state commission.

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
