The accompanying tariff material, issued on behalf of the National Exchange Carrier Association, Inc. (NECA) bearing Tariff F.C.C. No. 6, Business Data Services (BDS) Access Service, is sent to you for filing, in compliance with the Communications Act of 1934, as amended.

The filing, to become effective July 1, 2022, consists of tariff pages as indicated on the following check sheet:

This filing is made in response to the Commission's *RoR BDS Order*<sup>1</sup> and *2022 TRP Order* related to 2022 annual access tariff filings.<sup>2</sup> This filing revises rates and charges applicable to the provision of BDS Access Service for interstate access service provided by Telephone Companies participating in NECA Tariff F.C.C. No. 6, pursuant to section 69.3 of the Commission's Rules.

This filing removes packet-based and time division multiplexing greater than DS3 access services for Campti-Pleasant Hill Telephone Company (SAC 270426) based on the company's decision to detariff those services as required by the *RoR BDS Order*.<sup>3</sup>

Participants in this tariff elected incentive *ex ante* pricing regulation for BDS Time Division Multiplexing (TDM) and End User Channel Termination (EUCT) services with a bandwidth of DS3 or below. This filing includes data

to support the calculation of each participating Telephone Company's BDS rate elements subject to *ex ante* pricing regulation, as prescribed by the Commission's rate of return BDS rules.<sup>4</sup>

Of the 102 tariff participants, 38 operate under one of the seven holding companies listed below and chose to price their *ex ante* rate elements at the holding company level:

- Alliance Communications Cooperative, Inc. (SACs 351405, 361405, 391405, 391642, 391657)
- Consolidated Companies (SACs 371530, 371532, 371536, 371562)
- Farmers Mutual Cooperative Telephone Company (SACs 351149, 351168, 351235)
- Golden West Telecommunications Cooperative, Inc. (SACs 391640, 391659, 391667, 391677, 391684, 391686)
- Hanson Communications, Inc. (SACs 300604, 300618, 300633, 300649, 300659, 361370, 361476, 361487, 361515, 391660)
- Northwest Telephone Cooperative Association (SACs 351105, 351261)
- Townes Telecommunications (SACs 170200, 210335, 401729, 411807, 421807, 421893, 421935, 462190)

Twenty-one tariff participants continue to also tariff their non-*ex ante* rate elements for packet-based and TDM BDS greater than DS3, as permitted by the *RoR BDS Order* during the transition period.<sup>5</sup> Two tariff participants deemed competitive by the Commission's competitive market test<sup>6</sup>, North State Telephone, LLC (SAC 230491) and Pymatuning Independent Tel. Co. (SAC 170200), opted to keep their End User Channel Terminations at DS3 and below tariffed at this time, as permitted during the transition period.<sup>7</sup>

NECA seeks confidential treatment of this data pursuant to the *2022 Protective Order* designated for use in this proceeding.<sup>8</sup>

Accordingly, the confidential data files have been marked, "**CONTAINS PRIVILEGED AND CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION – DO NOT RELEASE (PER DA 22-591 PROTECTIVE ORDER).**" Attachment A of this Transmittal Letter contains detailed information regarding NECA's request for confidential treatment. This filing also includes a redacted version of the files identified in Attachment A marked, "**REDACTED – FOR PUBLIC INSPECTION.**"

### Request for Confidential Treatment

NECA seeks confidential treatment under the *2022 Protective Order* designated for use in this proceeding<sup>9</sup> for the data provided in the files identified below. This data is filed electronically via ETFS as part of the Tariff Review Plan for NECA's Tariff F.C.C. No. 6 Annual Tariff filing, made under Transmittal No. 1666. This data is required by the Commission to monitor rate of return exchange carrier compliance with incentive regulation rules for BDS electing carriers.<sup>10</sup>

Pursuant to the terms of the *2022 Protective Order*, signed declarations requesting access to the confidential information should be sent to the attention of Susan Boylan, NECA Senior Director Access Tariff Cost Development, via email to [Tariff6@neca.org](mailto:Tariff6@neca.org) or via facsimile at 973.599.6612. - Identification of the Commission proceeding in which the information was submitted or a description of the circumstances giving rise to the submission:

This information is filed electronically via ETFS in conjunction with NECA Tariff F.C.C. No. 6 Annual Access Charge Filing, Transmittal No. 1666 in WC Docket No. 22-108.

- Explanation of the degree to which the information is commercial or financial, or contains a trade secret or is privileged:

The information in the files contains sensitive study area-specific information for NECA Tariff No. 6 participants as required by Commission rules for monitoring compliance with the BDS incentive pricing model. At the study area and exchange level, the information is granular and highly confidential to the reporting Tariff No. 6 participants. The financial data is treated as a confidential trade secret by Tariff No. 6 participants.

- Explanation of the degree to which the information concerns a service that is subject to competition:

Rural telephone service has historically lent itself to “cherry picking” by competitors that choose to serve only the low-cost areas within a study area. Detailed information about revenues, expenses, and demand may help prospective competitors to gain insight to the participating Telephone Companies’ market strategies and gain competitive advantage.

- Identification of any measures taken by the submitting party to prevent unauthorized disclosure:

The information provided in the files is maintained on a confidential basis and made available only to NECA representatives on a need to know basis. Any public information is only made available on an aggregate basis.

- Identification of whether the information is available to the public and the extent of any previous disclosure of the information to third parties:

The information in the identified files is not publicly available.

- Justification of the period during which the submitting party asserts that material should not be available for public disclosure:

NECA requests that all Tariff No. 6 participant data provided in the TRP files identified above be treated as confidential indefinitely. Because of the sensitive nature of the data, it would not be appropriate for public disclosure at any time in the foreseeable future.

The *2022 Protective Order* places additional requirements on Authorized Representative(s) to destroy or return all confidential information, as well as copies and derivative materials, within two weeks after final resolution of this proceeding.<sup>13</sup>

- Any other information that the party seeking confidential treatment believes may be useful in assessing whether its request for confidentially should be granted:

NECA is submitting this information on behalf of the Telephone Companies that participate in NECA's Tariff No. 6. The Commission should take care to not deprive those Telephone Companies of the opportunity to speak for themselves in the event of a FOIA request for access to data. NECA requests that the Commission notify carriers of any FOIA request and allow them to be given a reasonable opportunity to file detailed information supporting continued confidential treatment of their respective data.

Accordingly, NECA requests confidential treatment of the Tariff No. 6 participant data provided in the files identified above pursuant to section 0.457 and 0.459 of the Commission's rules and paragraph 1 of the *2022 Protective Order*. Pursuant to the *2022 Protective Order*, NECA has marked each page of the non-redacted version of the identified files as follows:
