This filing, issued under authority of Special Permission No. 00-024, scheduled to become effective April 20, 2000, consists of tariff pages as indicated on the following Check Sheets:

With this transmittal, Pacific is further deferring the effective date of Transmittal No. 2102 from April 20, 2000 to May 20, 2000 to become effective on less than statutory notice.

On March 22, 2000, pursuant to paragraph (I)(6)(b) footnote 37 of Appendix C of the MO&O, Pacific filed Transmittal No. 2102 to make revisions to its Tariff FCC No. 128 to terminate the offering by Pacific of the following advanced services: Asynchronous Transfer Mode Cell Relay Service (ATM CRS), Frame Relay Service (FRS), Native LAN Plus (NL+), Switched Multi-Megabit Data Service (SMDS) and Asymmetrical Digital Subscriber Line (ADSL) service. On March 3, 2000, the FCC was notified by letter from Mr. Paul Mancini, attorney for SBC, that the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) had approved the Interconnection Agreement between Pacific Bell and SBC's separate Advanced Services affiliate in California ("ASI") with certain conditions. However, the CPUC approval includes a provision that bars ASI from providing all advanced services in the state of California, including jurisdictionally interstate services, until such time as its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPC&N) is approved.

Pacific's CPC&N was originally scheduled to be considered for approval by the CPUC on April 6, 2000, and as such Pacific filed Transmittal No. 2102 on March 22, 2000, on fifteen days' notice, to become effective on April 6, 2000. Subsequent to filing Transmittal No. 2102, Pacific learned that the CPUC rescheduled the review of Pacific's CPC&N to April 20, 2000. Therefore, it was necessary for Pacific to defer Transmittal No. 2102 from April 6, 2000 to April 20, 2000.

Pacific has reviewed a copy of the draft CPC&N scheduled to be considered for approval by the CPUC on April 20, 2000. The draft order includes a number of requirements that ASI must complete prior to serving customers in the state of California. One of the requirements that must be completed is customer notification that ASI will be the new provider of service. SBC anticipates that this notification will require thirty days to

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complete. Therefore, Pacific must further defer Transmittal No. 2102 from April 20, 2000 to May 20, 2000 in order to allow ASI adequate time to comply with the CPUC's customer notification requirement.

No supporting information discussed under Section 61.49 of the Commission's Rules is required with this filing.

In accordance with Section 61.32(b), the original Transmittal Letter, the Federal Communications Commission Form 159 and the filing fee have been submitted to a courier service for delivery to the Treasury Department lockbox located at the Mellon Bank in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

In accordance with Sections 61.32(a) and (c), the appropriate tariff pages are hereby delivered to the Secretary, Federal Communications Commission and the Chief, Tariff and Pricing Analysis Branch. These actions have been committed on the date established as the issued (filed) date as reflected above.
