On April 18, 2001, Verizon filed Transmittal No. 1373, which proposed changes to its provision of DC Power for Expanded Interconnection. Transmittal No. 1373 is scheduled to become effective April 26, 2001. In response to comments received concerning this transmittal, which

essentially focused on two areas -- the proposed rates and the penalty provisions -- Verizon is proposing to bifurcate review of the filing by withdrawing the penalty-setting portion of the transmittal and refileing it under separate transmittal. Doing so will allow FCC staff and industry commenters additional time to review and comment on the penalty provisions of the proposed tariff, while facilitating a more direct review of the supporting cost material and rates. Therefore, under authority of Special Permission No. 01-030 of the Federal Communications Commission, Verizon hereby withdraws a portion of the material originally included with Transmittal No. 1373.
