This year the Verizon Telephone Companies¹ are filing their 2002 Annual Price Cap Filing in compliance with Section 402 of the Telecommunications Act as well as the “CALLS” Order². Attached is an advance submission of Verizon’s 2002 Tariff Review Plan (TRP) made for the purpose of early review and submitted in the format prescribed in the 2002 Tariff Review Plan Order.³

This filing provided the necessary inputs and documentation to calculate the new Price Cap Indices. The Price Cap Indices reflect the use of 2001 base period demand, changes in exogenous
