The accompanying tariff material, issued by the Nevada Bell Telephone Company (NBTC) and bearing Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, is sent to you for filing in compliance with the requirements of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended.

This filing, scheduled to become effective February 18, 2003, consists of the tariff pages indicated on the following Check Sheets:

The purpose for this filing is threefold. First, NBTC proposes to move access order related revenue from the Traffic Sensitive basket to the Special Access basket to ensure compliance with Part 61.42 and remove demand associated with pricing flexibility MSAs. Second, NBTC proposes the following modifications to the Ordering Options section found in NBTC's Tariff F.C.C. No. 1:

- Standardize the existing Service Date Change Charge in SBC's 13-state territory.
- Establish a new rate element called Service Date Change Dispatch Charge.
- Restructure Service Date Change billing to recover costs for Service Date Change Dispatches.

Rate offsets necessary to ensure price cap compliance are included with this filing. Third, NBTC proposes miscellaneous text changes and additions to existing tariff language for clarification purposes.

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
Supporting information discussed under Sections 61.49 and 61.38 of the Commission's Rules, to the extent applicable, is included.
