1. Under authority of Special Permission No. 03-120 of the Federal Communications Commission, Verizon is introducing Local Package Basic in the state of Maryland and the District of Columbia. Local Package Plus is being introduced in the District of Columbia. Both Local Package Basic and Local Package Plus are optional service plans for residence Dial Station customers that combines local exchange services, unlimited Intrastate IntraLATA toll usage, and the choice of available Intrastate optional central office service features together with unlimited Interstate IntraLATA service.

Supporting material as described under Section 61.49 of Commission's Rules is not required with this filing.

2. Verizon is modifying a specialized arrangement for the Bank of New York that was originally filed under Bell Atlantic Transmittal No. 1268 on April 6, 2000. Verizon is providing the customer with a new option to purchase 1.25 Gbps Multiport Facility Arrangement(s) for the balance of the sixty-month contract period. A 1.25 Gbps Multiport Facility Arrangement utilizes a multiport interface card which allows for up to four channels to be associated with a single wavelength.
