This filing is being made by Qwest in its Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, Section 7, Private Line Transport Service, to reinstate tariff language that would allow upgrades in Bandwidth Capacity without incurring nonrecurring charges. Specifically, When customers with an existing fixed period service rate plan upgrade either their entire service or a portion of their service to a higher bandwidth capacity (e.g., DS3 to an OC3), nonrecurring charges will not apply to the upgraded lower speed services placed onto the new higher speed service. This customer benefit was previously grandfathered with other Upgrades in Capacity terms but is being reinstated at the request of customers.

In addition to the above change, Qwest is also correcting two USOC's in Section 16, Switched Access Service – Pricing Flexibility which were incorrectly listed in the tariff.
