With this filing, Verizon is filing revisions to introduce Transparent LAN Service in the New York-New Jersey Corridor. Transparent LAN Service is a high speed data service which uses a shared fiber network to allow for the interconnection of Local Area Networks (LANS) across selected metropolitan areas.

Transparent LAN Service is an interstate special access service utilizing category 1.2 facilities, as defined in Section 36.154, and is not a “loop-based” service per the definition in paragraph 61.3(yy) of the Commission’s rules). Therefore, pursuant to paragraph 61.49(f)(3), this new service is being filed without cost support. In addition, Figure 1 identifies Transparent LAN Service as a new Price Cap service for Tariff F.C.C. No. 1. Pursuant to Paragraph 173 of the Commission’s decision on pricing flexibility (FCC 99-206 Fifth Report and Order and Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, released August 27, 1999), Figure 1 demonstrates the basket and service category into which this service will be properly incorporated in the next Annual Filing in 2004.

This transmittal letter and associated attachments are being filed electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS).

Payment in the amount of \$695.00 has been electronically transmitted to the Mellon Bank in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, in accordance with the fee program procedures. The Form 159 is being transmitted electronically over ETFS as a proprietary document.
