1. INTRODUCTION

With this filing, John Staurulakis, Inc. (“JSI”) proposes to add Smart City Telecommunications LLC d/b/a/ Smart City Telecom (“SCT”) as an issuing carrier to JSI Tariff FCC No. 1 effective December 16, 2003. Corresponding to adding SCT as an issuing carrier to JSI Tariff FCC No. 1, SCT is canceling SCT Tariff FCC No. 1 effective December 16, 2003.

2. DESCRIPTION OF TARIFF FILING

SCT Tariff FCC No. 1 references the regulations contained in National Exchange Carrier Association (“NECA”) Tariff FCC No. 1 pursuant to the blanket waiver of Sections 61.54(a), 61.54(j), and 61.74(a) of the Commission's Rules granted to carriers filing under Section 61.39 by the Common Carrier Bureau in DA 88-1893, released December 9, 1988. Under DA 88-1893, the Commission requires that carriers reference NECA rate regulations *in toto*. To respond to circumstances unique to SCT, SCT needs for certain services to provide services under regulations and rate structures different than those in NECA Tariff FCC No. 5. Thus, to have both the flexibility to have unique regulations and rate structures and the convenience of a group tariff, SCT has elected to become an issuing carrier in JSI Tariff FCC No. 1 and cancel SCT Tariff FCC No. 1 effective December 16, 2003.

The filing to add SCT as an issuing carrier for JSI Tariff FCC No. 1 does not change any rate; all rates charged by SCT under JSI Tariff FCC No. 1 effective December 16, 2003 will be the same as the rates currently charged under SCT Tariff FCC No. 1.

All services currently offered under SCT Tariff FCC No. 1 will be offered by SCT under JSI Tariff FCC No. 1.

No new services with respect to those offered by SCT will be introduced in this filing. The following services being introduced in this filing for JSI Tariff FCC No. 1 serve only, at this time, to include regulations in JSI Tariff FCC No. 1 for services currently offered by SCT:

- 1) ATM-CRS Access Service
- 2) Wholesale DSL Transport
- 3) Provision of Synchronous Optical Channel Service Channel Termination under mileage-sensitive rates.
- 4) Provision of Synchronous Optical Channel Service under the term and volume discount plan applicable to SCT's current Synchronous Optical Channel Service rates.
