On March 12, 2004, the Verizon Telephone Companies (Verizon) filed Application No. 107 to request a waiver of Section 61.58 of the Commission's Rules. Verizon is amending its application to request a waiver of Section 61.59 instead of Section 61.58 in order to revise material that has not been in effect for 30 days.

On March 3, 2004, Verizon filed Transmittal No. 418, which included tariff revisions to reflect proposed changes to the Federal Universal Service Fund (FUSF) rates caused by the expiration of the charge associated with the recovery of local number portability costs in its Tariff F.C.C. Nos. 14 and 16. On March 10, Verizon filed Transmittal No. 421, which contained similar tariff revisions for its Tariff F.C.C. Nos. 1 and 11.

Verizon updates its multi-line line counts in its standard quarterly filings. The Waiver Order released March 14, 2003 allowed Verizon to bill FUSF charges using the Presubscribed Interexchange Carrier Charges (PICC) equivalency structure for Centrex customers in accordance with existing F.C.C. rules. A rate adjustment (RAF) was applied across all multi-line rates to develop FUSF rates that fully recover Verizon's quarterly obligation. Thus, for the 2nd quarter filing these updated multi-line counts, coupled with the multi-line equivalency calculation, resulted in both increases and reductions to some multi-line rates even though the contribution factor remained the same as the first quarter. The rates for residential, non-primary residential, and single line business did not change as they are not impacted by the multi-line equivalency calculation. Verizon is filing its Second Quarter 2004 FUSF filing on March 17, 2004. It will propose further revisions to its FUSF rates prior to Transmittal Nos. 418 and 421 being in effect for 30 days.

Verizon is amending its application to request a waiver of Section 61.59 in order to revise material that has not been in effect for 30 days.

This Amended Application is being filed electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission's Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS).

Payment in the amount of \$695.00 has been electronically transmitted to the Mellon Bank in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, in accordance with the fee program procedures. The Form 159 is being transmitted electronically via ETFS as a proprietary document.

In accordance with the requirements of Section 61.21(a)(3) of the Commission's Rules, the F.C.C. Registration Number (FRN) for Verizon is 0003-7085-00. Verizon is filing this amended application on behalf of issuing carriers with the following FRNs:
