Introduction of Charges for Additional Labor -
Testing and Maintenance with Other Telephone Companies and Other Labor

INTRODUCTION

Verizon is submitting revisions to its Tariff F.C.C. No. 1, Access Service, to reinstate a subset of charges for Additional Labor. Additional Labor is labor that is requested by the customer on a service and agreed to by Verizon. Verizon provides advance notice to the customer that additional labor charges will apply before any additional labor is undertaken. Additional Labor includes such things as overtime installation, overtime repair and stand by of Verizon personnel in excess of a half hour.

Testing and Maintenance with Other Telephone Companies includes additional testing, maintenance or repair of facilities which connect to facilities of other telephone companies which is in addition to normal effort required to test, maintain or repair facilities provided exclusively by Verizon. The regulations for Testing and Maintenance with Other Telephone Companies are found in Section 13.2.4 of the tariff.

Other Labor is any additional labor not specifically itemized within the regulations for additional labor. The regulations for Other Labor are found in Section 13.2.5.

Additional Labor charges were included in the tariff in the final Rate of Return filing. The corresponding charges were subsequently removed from the tariff in 1994 under Transmittal No. 644. Since that time, Verizon has not charged for Other Labor in the Tariff FCC No. 1. Verizon has determined that the charges as constituted in its Tariff FCC Nos. 11, 14 and 16 are more appropriate, and with this filing, is reinstating the charges and USOCs in Tariff FCC No. 1.

REASON FOR THIS FILING

Verizon wishes to align Tariff FCC No. 1 with its other access tariffs by establishing charges for Testing and Maintenance with Other Telephone Companies and Other Labor.
