This filing is being made on 15 days' notice under the Commission's streamlined filing procedures, and proposes the following revisions to Tariff F.C.C. No. 3:

- 1) Addition of rates introducing Sprint SONET Ring ServiceSM in the states of Oregon and Washington, while expanding the provision of Sprint SONET Ring ServiceSM in Sprint LTC's Midwest jurisdiction to include customers in the states of Kansas, Nebraska, Texas and Wyoming, and the Southeast jurisdiction to include customers in the state of South Carolina.
- 2) Addition of rates introducing Operator Transfer Service (OTS) and Operator Inward Assistance (OIA) in the states of Oregon and Washington.
- 3) Within-band, within-cap rate adjustments for special access STS1 level services. It should be noted that there is no impact to customers since Sprint LTC currently has no demand for this service.
- 4) Special access STS1 level rate adjustments in various metropolitan statistical areas (MSAs) where pricing flexibility has been granted pursuant to Subpart H of Part 69 of the Commission's rules.

- 5) Removal of expired special construction Individual Case Basis filings in various states.
- 6) Minor tariff language changes designed to clarify the provision of interstate access services.


Cost support material in accordance with Sections 61.38 and 61.41 through 61.49 of the Commission's Rules is provided, where required, for this filing.
