- (C) Handicapped Exemption - Those handicapped Customers who qualify for exemptions from Local Directory Assistance charges under Local Exchange Company tariff(s), or in the absence of a local Directory Assistance charge plan, receive special rates on other Local Exchange Company services, are exempted from the interstate Directory Assistance Charge.

This exemption applies only to calls to Directory Assistance which are billed to the handicapped Customer's residence telephone number.

- (D) Credit - A credit will be given for calls to Directory Assistance when:

- the Customer experiences poor transmission or is cut-off during the call.
- the Customer is given an incorrect telephone number, or
- the Customer inadvertently misdials (e.g. the caller dialed 201-555-1212 when they intended to dial 203-555-1212).

To receive the credit, the Customer must notify an operator or Business Office of the problem experienced.

3.1.5 N.Y.-N.J. Corridor Optional Calling Plan(A) General

The N.Y.-N.J. Corridor Optional Calling Plan provides residence and business customers with the option of reduced charges for interstate directly-dialed station-to-station toll calls between the five boroughs of New York City and Bergen, Essex, Hudson, Passaic and Union Counties in New Jersey. Residence and business customers may subscribe to a 1-hour block of time per month which covers all such calls made during the day, evening and night rate periods at the following charges. Additional usage beyond the initial block of time is billed based on the time of the usage in increments for each additional minute of usage or fraction thereof. Additional usage is considered Peak usage Monday through Friday from 8:00 A.M. to but not including 5:00 P.M., and Off-Peak Monday through Friday from 5:00 P.M. to but not including 8:00 A.M., all day Saturday and Sunday, and all day on Holidays as set forth in 3.1.3(E) preceding:

- (1) The charge applicable for the initial 1 hour block of time is a monthly minimum charge, whether or not the subscriber makes any calls. The initial block of time and additional usage rates are billed in arrears.
- (2) Only directly dialed station-to-station calls that originate from the subscriber's telephone are included in the Optional Calling Plan time. Directory Assistance and Operator-Assisted calls are not included in the Optional Calling Plan time.
- (3) Evening and Night rate period discounts do not apply to calls in the Optional Calling Plan.
- (4) The Optional Calling Plan is furnished for a minimum period of one month.
- (5) A customer may subscribe to the Optional Calling Plan for each separately billed number.
- (6) Changes to or from an Optional Calling Plan for existing subscribers may be effective only on the subscriber's bill date.
- (7) The initial block of time rate may be prorated only when telephone service is connected, disconnected or temporarily suspended during a billing period.
- (8) Each call placed under the Optional Calling Plan will be counted as a minimum of one (1) minute of usage. Fractional minutes of usage will be rounded to the next whole minute.
- (9) The N.Y.-N.J. Corridor Optional Calling Plan is not available in combination with the Business Corridor Optional Calling Plan, as set forth in 3.1.6 following.
