With this filing, NBTC proposes to enhance the Government Emergency Telecommunications Services (GETS) by introducing GETS Office Wide Queuing (OWQ). GETS OWQ is a feature that provides priority call processing on an office wide (per switch) basis rather than on a trunk group basis. Enhancing the existing GETS Egress Queuing (EQ) to the GETS (OWQ) feature, offers performance on an office wide (per switch), basis resulting in improved communication flow during emergency situations. The Federal Government has requested this enhancement through its authorized agent and is the only customer authorized to use this feature.

Supporting information discussed under Section 61.38 of the Commission's Rules is, to the extent applicable, included with this filing. Some of this information is filed with a request that it be treated as confidential under the Freedom of Information Act.
