

Description and Justification

In this filing, Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company LLC (CBT) proposes to withdraw Electronic Listing Information Service (ELIsm), an online dial-up electronic access to the customer listings database. This service, with a very limited customer base, may be replaced by Internet Directory Assistance (internet access to the customer listings database). Therefore, CBT proposes to no longer offer ELIsm Service to its customers.

On February 1, 2005, CBT filed an application with the Federal Communications Commission requesting authority, under Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934 as amended, 47 U.S.C. 214 and Section 63.71 of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. 63.71, to discontinue the provision of ELIsm to customers. All requirements have been satisfied - all affected customers have been notified of this proposed change by letter.

Since no comments were filed during the comment period, CBT's application to withdraw ELIsm Service was automatically granted March 11, 2005 - 31 days following the release date of the public notice on February 7, 2005.
