NBTC proposes to re-file Contract Offer No. 4 – 2005 Access Extension Offer, an access pricing package plan into F.C.C. No. 1 Section 23. Contract Offer No. 4 is an access discount plan for which concurrent subscription is required in the following access tariffs: Ameritech Operating Companies (Ameritech) Tariff F.C.C. No. 2; Pacific Bell Telephone Company (PBTC) Tariff F.C.C. No. 1; Southwestern Bell Telephone Company (SWBT) Tariff F.C.C. No. 73; and The Southern New England Telephone Company (SNET) Tariff F.C.C. No. 39 (collectively referred to as the “Qualified Companies”).

When submitting its filing on July 29, 2005, SBC Communications Inc. (SBC) encountered extreme internet congestion while making the NBTC and other related filings. Consequently, the tariffed Contract Offers filed by PBTC and NBTC were not filed by the 7:00pm Eastern Time deadline, thus leaving two of them with incorrect Issued and Effective Dates. Since each Contract Offer requires the customer to simultaneously subscribe to the identical contract in each of SBC’s currently effective tariffs, NBTC is withdrawing the tariff material filed under Transmittal No. 107 in order to re-file it so that it becomes effective concurrently with the other associated tariffed Contract Offers.

The concurrent subscription requirement, as described in Section 23.4.2 (C), is necessary to enable the Qualified Companies to offer the Customer greater discounts. This contract offering is only available from August 4, 2005, through September 4, 2005 and is not renewable.

In accordance with Section 61.14, this Transmittal Letter and associated attachments are being filed electronically today via the Federal Communications Commission’s Electronic Tariff Filing System (ETFS) in compliance with the electronic filing procedures.

Payment in the amount of \$720.00 has been electronically transmitted to the Mellon Bank in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, in accordance with the fee program procedures. The Form 159 is being transmitted electronically via ETFS as a proprietary document. These actions have been committed on the date established as the issued (filed) date as reflected above.
